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Suspicious Substance Response Guidelines

Important: If exposed persons are experiencing physical symptoms, call 911

Step 1: Record the answers to the questions

Is the container opened or unopened?			
Is a suspicious substance visible that cannot be explained?			
Is the substance a solid or liquid?			
Are there any individuals experiencing symptoms immediately after exposure? If yes, ensure to note the type of symptom(s) in Step 3.			
If this involved a letter or package, was it accompanied by a threat?			
If yes, describe the threat:

Step 2: Provide the following instructions:

- 1. Do not handle the substance or container.
- 2. Do not smell, taste, or touch substance or container.
- 3. Do not try to clean up the substance.
- 4. Leave the area. Isolate area. 75' for solids, 150' for liquids.
- 5. Close the door off the area to prevent others from entering.
- 6. Turn off fans or ventilation units if substance is indoors.
- 7. Report the incident to the supervisor or building security official if location is a business or agency.
- 8. Assure all involved parties that the appropriate authorities are being contacted.

9. Instruct those who handled the substance or container:

- Wash hands with soap and water.
- If the material spilled onto clothing, remove contaminated clothing, place clothing in a plastic bag and seal it. Shower with soap and water as soon as possible. There is no need to use bleach or harsh disinfectant on skin.
- Exposed individuals are to remain in an isolated or safe area until they are appropriately decontaminated.
