CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Jessica Hawkins called the April Governor's Task Force on the Prevention of Underage Drinking meeting to order at 1:37 p.m. and declared a quorum was present.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Ms. Hawkins welcomed the members and the guests.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The April meeting minutes were distributed. Ms. Sabrina Mackey made a motion to approve the April meeting minutes and Mr. Keith Burt seconded the motion. The April meeting minutes were approved.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE RESPONSIBLE BEVERAGE SERVICE AND SALES TRAINING (RBSS)

Ms. Hawkins stated that Oklahoma Prevention Policy Alliance (OPPA) conducted the original research on the RBSS curriculum approximately two years ago. The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) received the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) which partnered with the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission and University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center (OUHSC) to evaluate the RBSS curriculum. The expectations are to have OUHSC

prepare a preliminary report and possibly attend the task force meeting to receive feedback from the members. In the last month, approximately 50 people have been trained to train on RBSS. The RBSS Committee has been reestablished and will meet quarterly to evaluate the process. No action was taken.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING 2M2L REPORT

Ms. Hawkins informed the members that Ms. Adrienne Rollins is currently working with the Tulsa and Oklahoma City County Sherriff's Office to develop underage drinking task forces for each metro area. ODMHSAS recently re-applied for the JAG and added a budget item to increase funds for the task forces.

There's an upcoming 2M2L training in Woodward on May 18-19, 2010. The people who should attend are community members and law enforcement. There are more upcoming trainings in 2010 that will be held in Lawton and McAlester. There will be a Place of Last Drink presentation at the next task force meeting.

The 2M2L Youth Council has been trained on media advocacy. They can go back to their 2M2L clubs and teach the members. The Council is discussing doing a 2M2L Academy instead of the 2M2L Camp. The Council will take the lead on the activity piece. The Academy will consist of two big events with one being held in June and the other held in July. The youth will have to apply on-line for the academy; where they will receive a username and password. There will be five webinar trainings throughout the year. The Youth Council agreed to partner with Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD). The National Affiliate for SADD at the ODMHSAS is Ms. Rollins; she is serving as the SADD Coordinator for Oklahoma. All of the Council members will be able to attend the SADD conference in Orlando at the end of June. The next 2M2L Youth Council meeting will be in Lawton on May 15th. No action was taken.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE OPPA REPORT

Ms. Gwynn Busby announced the change in venue for the OPPA/OSASA Retreat during June 3-4, 2010. The retreat will be held at the University of Central Oklahoma Conference Center in Edmond, Oklahoma. The brochure is being developed and the registration fee to attend the retreat is \$125.00. At the next OPPA meeting they will vote on officers and the new officers will be announced at the retreat. No action was taken.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING 2010 UNDERAGE DRINKING LEGISLATION

Ms. Busby provided an update on some of the legislature bills. Senator Leftwich's party bus bill was assigned to Public Safety on March 16th; Senator Brown's bill (SB2240) is dead; Representative Duncan's bill passed the House and Committee (HB2297), OPPA will watch the language; it strengthens the penalties. HB2348 – passed House and is out of committee (legalizing home brew). OPPA has not taken a stand on HB2348; they are just following the bill. No action was taken.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Gayle Jones provided Healthy and Safety Skills for Youth brochure to the task force members and participants.

Ms. Hawkins provided a handout on high risk drinking and reduce use to youth. It was mentioned to possibly to do a presentation. Ms. Hawkins provided the website, <http://www.marininstitute.org/site/>. Ms. Hawkins spoke about the Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant (SPF SIG) project; the State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup (SEOW) is running data on prescription drugs and underage drinking (which are the top two priorities). The SEOW members will make the recommendation to the Advisory Council; the Advisory Council will make the final decision. Ms. Hawkins invited everyone to the SEOW meeting tomorrow, April 21st, at United Way, 9:00-11:00. The ODMHSAS epidemiologist may attend the next task force meeting to present underage drinking data.

ADJOURNMENT

Ms. Busby made a motion to adjourn the April meeting. Ms. Teresa Ryan seconded the motion to adjourn the April meeting. The April meeting was adjourned at 2:44 p.m..
