CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Jessica Hawkins called the February 19, 2009 regular Governor's Task Force on Prevention of Underage Drinking meeting to order.

WELCOME

Ms. Hawkins declared a quorum was not present and could not officially approve the minutes or take action on any agenda items. Copies of the January 15, 2009 meeting minutes were distributed.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

The new appointment names were forwarded to the Governor's Office. At this time, we are waiting on official appointee letters from the Governor's Office.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING PRIORITIZATION FOR ACTION ON TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Task Force discussed what role to play and decide where interest may be. Recommendation 1 was discussed and Mr. Keith Burt informed the Task Force that the ABLE Commission has lost thirty people; they are in need of more man power. There are twenty-six agents statewide, there's an Attorney General Opinion that states ABLE can not enforce laws related to 3.2 beer. Therefore, it's the local jurisdiction responsibility to monitor the sale of low point beer. Recommendation 2

was discussed and there's progress happening on both items. Senator Lamb authored the bill but it's not moving, it will not be heard on the Senate side. The Task Force discussed sending a letter to Representative Steele in support of the Social Host Bill and stating that members of the Task Force are willing to meet with legislators to provide education. There's a committee working on the RBSS training. ABLE is helping to get information to provide for the restaurant training project. ODMHSAS can offer GPS/GIS services that APRCs can utilize. Recommendation 3 was discussed and it was suggested to make a presentation on what is included in the EUDL application at the next meeting. Recommendation 4 was discussed and the issue related to Alcopops classification does not appear to be a legislative issue. ABLE sent material for testing on the product and formula; there are no results from OSBI. Recommendation 5 was discussed; the Task Force suggested evaluating what communities are doing concerning the social host law and evaluate the enforcement. Recommendation 6 was discussed and it was suggested to request a meeting with the Municipal League and inform them that cities can adopt ordinances to enforce at the local level. Recommendation 7 was discussed and the suggestion was made to continue to have discussion at the State level. It was also discussed that the Task Force members should take a field trip to watch compliance checks or maybe do a risk assessment. Recommendation 8 was discussed and it was suggested to start a pilot study and implement statewide. Recommendation 9 was discussed; there's a sub-committee that will produce 3 short videos (youth, youth access, and public awareness). Recommendation 10 was discussed; there are 2M2L camps and clubs. It was suggested to get a youth focus group, broad range of youth members; not only use leadership youth. It was suggested that 2M2L host a listening conference or a web cast. Recommendation 11 was discussed and there is a State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup in place. There were suggestions that the Task Force should send a letter to the schools showing support and sharing how valuable the OPNA surveys are to the State. Recommendation 12 was discussed and SBIRT (Screening Brief Intervention Referral to Treatment) is already in place and there's promoting going on for screening to be done in ERs and hospitals.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING SENATE BILL 641

There's no action needed from the Task Force. The Task Force is supportive of the bill and is not opposed to drafting a letter if needed.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

This agenda item was discussed while the Task Force discussed Recommendation 2 under the Prioritization for Action on Task Force Recommendations agenda item.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Hawkins provided a Support 21 Act of 2009 handout that she received while attending the CADCA (Community Anti-Drug Coalition) Conference in Washington DC.
