

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
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OUR WHY




EAGLE EATS LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

WORK HOURS


Employees meet twice per week for 30 minutes each time to develop menus, learn their jobs and responsibilities and prepare for sale day.


WELLNESS ROOMS




WHAT DOES THIS LEAD TO....


