Video Visitation Terms and Conditions

Participation in video-visitation is a privilege, not a right. Participants (visitors and inmates) are expected to always conduct themselves in an appropriate fashion during a video visit.

Oklahoma Department of Corrections (ODOC) reserves the right to deny, cancel, or terminate a video visit prior to or during a visitation session based upon visitor or inmate misconduct or a facility emergency - and potentially enforce penalties/sanctions against future visits.

Video Visitation Rules

- All regular, in-person visitation rules apply
- Participants must be and remain seated during the visit session.
- Once the video visitation has begun, participants may not touch the visitation screen or cover the camera in any way.
- All clothing must remain in place as partial exposure or nudity is prohibited.
- o Pictures and/or photographs may not be shown during the visit.
- Food and/or drink are prohibited during the visit.
- Only visitors registered and logged for a specified visit are allowed to be a part of the video visitation. The attempt by any other party to engage in the visitation is prohibited.
- Visitors that knowingly violate court orders shall not be permitted visitation privileges.
- Visitors shall be at least 18 years of age, or a parent or legal guardian must accompany minors.
- Visitors that appear to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol will not be permitted visitation privileges.
- Refer to ODOC Policy: OP-030118 entitled "Visitation" and OP-030119 entitled "Inmate Telephone Privileges."

Visitation FAQs

- o ID's must be presented to register and/or schedule a visit. Acceptable forms of ID are:
 - U.S. Driver License or state issued Identification Card
 - Active U.S. Military ID
 - Passport
 - Consulate ID

ID's presented must be valid. (example: not expired)

- Visitors may be subject to warrant and probation checks.
- Any damage to Securus property or other criminal actions will be prosecuted.
- Use of this video visitation system constitutes consent to recording and monitoring.
- Video visits with approved attorneys will not be recorded pursuant to OP-030118 III.C and OP-030119 II. However, due to location of video equipment, video visits with attorneys will take place in the same location as regular visits and therefore ODOC cannot guarantee physical privacy or surroundings during the visit.
- Scheduling & Availability: All visitors must schedule visits at least 48 hours prior to the desired visit.

Visitation Hours:

All video visitations will be scheduled according to facility posted visitation schedules.
