Guidelines and Procedures

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS MAY RESULT IN YOUR TERMINATION FROM THE ELECTRONIC MONITORING PROGRAM FOR DUI OFFENDERS. THIS COULD RESULT IN YOUR RECLASSIFICATION TO A HIGHER PLEASE INITIAL BY EACH OF THE FOLLOWING SECURITY FACILITY. PARAGRAPHS TO ACKNOWLEGDE THAT YOU HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD ITS CONTENT.

1.	You will not remove tamper or place any obstruction between your bracelet and leg. You understand the equipment is designed to detect interference or tampering.
2.	You will connect all electronic monitoring equipment to your landline phone at all times and as instructed by your officer. You may only disconnect or move the electronic monitoring upon specific instruction from a supervising officer.
3.	You understand that if electricity/telephone is disconnected due to late payment, non-payment, etc., this will be considered a violation. If you lose electricity/telephone service through no fault of your own, you are to contact your officer immediately.
4.	You will immediately report to your officer if your equipment is damaged.
5.	You agree if applicable to be physically in range of your modem prior to your designated reporting times and will remain in range of the modem as instructed by your officer.
6.	You will remain current with all payments to the agency (if applicable).
7.	You will submit work verification and verified work schedules upon request from your supervising officer. You must obtain authorization for a schedule change a minimum of 12 hours in advance from a supervising officer.
8.	You will allow the equipment to be inspected upon request, which could result in missed work, or alteration of your daily schedule.
9.	You are responsible for the care and damage to the equipment that is issued to you, other than normal wear and tear. You could be held criminally responsible for any equipment damage, loss or theft.
10.	If you are assigned to GPS monitoring, you will place the miniature tracking device (MTD) in the powered-up docking station for a minimum of six hours per day and at all times while at home. The docking station should be placed in a central location of your residence to allow for maximum movement throughout your residence.
11.	If you are assigned to GPS monitoring, you will ensure the MTD is placed in an unobstructed area at all times with the display facing out. Any carrying case must be preapproved prior to use. You cannot place the MTD in any covered containers, locker, trunk, hidden under clothing or car seats, purses, tote bags, etc.
