

How old must you be
to register to vote in
Oklahoma?



You must be at least 18 years old on election day to register to vote.

You can pre-register to vote if you are at least 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ years old, but your registration will not become valid and you cannot vote until you are 18 years old.

How long must you live
in Oklahoma before you
can register to vote?

You are not required to live in Oklahoma for any specified length of time before being eligible to apply for voter registration.

I swear or affirm under penalty of perjury that:
• I am a citizen of the United States and I am a resident of the State of Oklahoma.
• I am 18 years old or older, or I am at least 17½ years old and I understand that I cannot vote in any election before I am 18 years old.
• I have not been convicted of a felony, or if I have been previously convicted, I am now eligible to register to vote pursuant to 28 C.W.A. Stat. § 6-101.
• I am not now under judgment as an incapacitated person. I am not under the care of a court-appointed person prohibited from registering to vote.
• The information I have given is true. I reside at the address given. I understand that submitting false information to the voter registration board is a felony, punishable by up to five years in prison, by a fine of not more than \$50,000, or both.

You can submit a voter registration form at any time.

If election officials receive your application 24 days or less before an election, you will not become a registered voter until after the election.

The names of recognized political parties are printed on the official Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form.

If you write in the name of a political party that is not recognized in Oklahoma, your application still will be processed and you will become registered as an Independent voter.

Why register with a political party?

- ▶ Political party members may vote for that party's candidates in primary elections.
- ▶ Political party members may not vote for another party's candidates in primary elections.
- ▶ Political parties may allow Independent voters to vote in their primaries.

What are political organizations?



A political organization is not a political party, and it cannot place candidates on the ballot.

Contact the State Election Board or your County Election Board for a list of currently recognized political parties and political organizations.



All voters may vote on nonpartisan races and questions at primary and runoff primary elections.

All voters may vote in general elections and nonpartisan elections.

All voters may vote for any candidate of any party on a general election ballot.

After applying for voter registration, how do you know you are a registered voter?



When you receive your voter identification card in the mail from the County Election Board.

When you receive your voter identification card, examine it carefully and report any mistakes to the County Election Board immediately.



If the County Election Board cannot approve your application for voter registration, you will receive a letter that explains why your application cannot be approved.

The letter may tell you how to correctly apply again.



Does voter
registration
expire?



You will remain registered as long as you vote regularly.

Even if you don't vote, you will remain registered if you respond to periodic mailings from the County Election Board to confirm that your address is still the same.

What do you do if you
move, change your
name, or change your
political affiliation?



Fill out a new voter registration application form with the new information or update your information using the OK Voter Portal.

After the County Election Board approves the new application form, you will receive a new voter identification card.



After you're registered,
where do you vote?




On election day, you may vote only at the polling place for the precinct where you are registered.

Before election day, you may vote absentee in-person at your County Election Board or a designated location.

You can also vote by absentee ballot.

Who can vote by absentee ballot?

Any registered voter may request
absentee ballots for any election in
which the voter is eligible to vote.

Voters are not be required to state any
reason for the request.

to show identification when
they vote.

How do you prove your
identity when you vote?



Use the voter identification card
issued by the County Election Board.

If you lose it, you may request a
new one from your County Election
Board free of charge.

You also may use identification which was issued by the State of Oklahoma, the federal government, or a federally-recognized tribal government such as:

- ▶ An Oklahoma driver license
- ▶ A US passport
- ▶ A military ID
- ▶ A tribal ID

In order to be considered valid, any of these IDs must include:

- ▶ A photograph
- ▶ A name that substantially conforms (matches) the name on the voter registration record
- ▶ If there is an expiration date, it must be later than the date of the election

If your name isn't in the
precinct registry or you
don't have ID, can you
still cast a ballot?

If your name is not in the Precinct Registry, or if you are unable to provide ID, state and federal laws permit you to cast a provisional ballot.

A provisional ballot is not put through the voting device but instead is sealed inside an envelope. Voters who cast provisional ballots must sign an affidavit that explains why they think they are eligible to vote.
