## Contribution & Expenditure threshold limit – Rep. Steagall

### **Rule 2.70. When to File a Candidate Committee Statement of Organization.**

**A Statement of Organization for a candidate committee shall be filed with the Commission at any earlier time but no later than ten (10) days after the candidate has accepted or expended more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for his or her campaign.**

- **Proposal:** Lower the baseline amount of funds a Candidate Committee may accept or expend from \$1,000 to \$400 before said Candidate Committee must file a Statement of Organization with the Ethics Commission.



**Rule 2.2 (7) “Electioneering communication”** means any communication or series of communications that is sent by Internet advertising, direct mail, broadcast by radio, television, cable or satellite, or appears in a newspaper or magazine that (a) refers to a clearly identified candidate for state office, (b) is made within sixty (60) days before a general election (including a special general election) or thirty (30) days before a primary or runoff primary election (including a special primary or runoff primary election) for the office sought by the candidate, (c) that is targeted to the relevant electorate and (d) does not explicitly advocate the election or defeat of any candidate. “Relevant electorate” shall mean twenty-five thousand (25,000) or more persons in the State of Oklahoma in the case of a candidate for statewide elective office, two thousand five hundred (2,500) or more persons in the district the candidate seeks to represent in the case of a candidate for the Oklahoma State House of Representatives or judge of the District Court, and five thousand (5,000) or more persons in the district the candidate seeks to represent in the case of all other elective state offices;

**Rule 2.2(11) “Independent expenditure”** means an expenditure made by a person for a communication expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate or a vote for or against the retention of a judicial retention candidate that is not made in coordination with, cooperation with, consultation with, or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, a candidate, a candidate committee, or their agents, or a political party committee or its agents. An independent expenditure shall not include the display of a noncommercial yard sign, lapel pin, button, bumper sticker or similar de minimis display of support or opposition to a political party or a candidate;

**Rule 2.53. Political Party Electronic Advertisement Disclosure Requirements.**

Whenever a political party committee makes an expenditure for the purpose of a communication through any Internet advertising, or video, radio, television, cable or satellite broadcast, the communication shall state, either orally or in writing of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly readable by the recipient of the communication: “Authorized and paid for by NAME OF POLITICAL PARTY COMMITTEE”.

**Rule 2.54. Political Party Printed Advertisement Disclosure Requirements.**

Whenever a political party committee makes an expenditure for the purpose of a communication through Internet advertising, direct mail, magazine advertisement, newspaper advertisement or any other printed medium, the communication shall state in writing of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly readable by the recipient of the communication: “Authorized and paid for by NAME OF POLITICAL PARTY COMMITTEE”. This provision shall not apply to bumper stickers, campaign buttons, t-shirts, aerial advertising or similar advertisements of such a nature that inclusion of a disclaimer would be impractical.

**Rule 2.56. Candidate Committee Printed Advertisements Disclosure Requirements.**

Whenever a candidate committee makes an expenditure for the purpose of a communication through Internet advertising, or direct mail, magazine advertisement, newspaper advertisement or any other printed medium, the communication shall state in writing of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly readable by the recipient of the communication: “Authorized and paid for by NAME OF COMMITTEE”. Provided that for campaign signs, banners and other campaign materials capable of re-use, the name of the committee for purposes of this Rule is the name of the committee as registered with the Ethics Commission but is not required to include the year of the election for which the committee is formed. This provision shall not apply to bumper stickers, campaign buttons, t-shirts, aerial advertising or similar advertisements of such a nature that inclusion of a disclaimer would be impractical.

**Rule 2.58. Independent Expenditure, Electioneering Communication, and State Question Communication Printed Advertisement Disclosure Requirements.**

**A.** Whenever an independent expenditure or electioneering communication is made for the purpose of a communication through Internet advertising, direct mail, magazine advertisement, newspaper advertisement or any other printed medium, the communication shall state in writing of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly readable by the recipient of the communication: “Not authorized by any candidate or candidate committee. Authorized and paid for by” to be followed by the name of the person who paid for the communication, the person’s permanent street address and telephone number. This provision shall not apply to bumper stickers, campaign buttons, t-shirts, aerial advertising or similar advertisements of such a nature that inclusion of a disclaimer would be impractical.

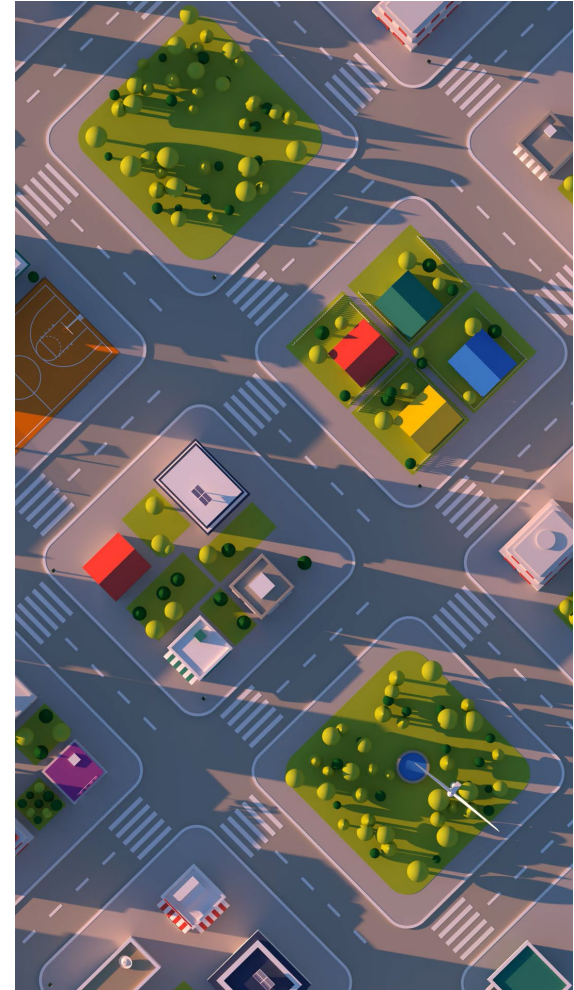
**B.** Whenever a state question communication is made for the purpose of a communication through Internet advertising, direct mail, magazine advertisement, newspaper advertisement or any other printed medium, the communication shall state in writing of sufficient size and contrast to be clearly readable by the recipient of the communication: “Authorized and paid for by” to be followed by the name of the person who paid for the communication, the person’s permanent street address and telephone number. This provision shall not apply to bumper stickers, campaign buttons, t-shirts, aerial advertising or similar advertisements of such a nature that inclusion of a disclaimer would be impractical.

Proposed Commission Comment regarding mileage reimbursement reporting requirements pursuant to Ethics Rules 2.43 and 2.106.

### **Rule 2.43. Candidate Committee Expenditures.**

Contributions to a candidate committee may be used to make expenditures for ordinary and necessary campaign expenses[.] Expenditures made to reimburse a candidate for personal expenditures made on behalf of the candidate committee must be made within ninety (90) days of the original expenditure and must be reported **in detail as required by Rule 2.106.**



## **Proposed Commission Comment regarding mileage reimbursement reporting requirements pursuant to Ethics Rules 2.43 and 2.106.**

### **Rule 2.106. Report Requirements for Candidate Committee.**

A Report of Contributions and Expenditures by a candidate committee shall include, but not be limited to, the following information:

B. (6) the name and address of any person or entity to whom an expenditure of more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) in the aggregate was made during the time period covered by the report, a description of the goods or services purchased with the expenditure, and the aggregate total of all expenditures made to the person or entity, provided however:

(e) All expenditures made to reimburse a candidate for personal expenditures made on behalf of the committee shall be itemized in detail, regardless of their value.



## Proposed Commission Comment regarding mileage reimbursement reporting requirements pursuant to Ethics Rules 2.43 and 2.106.

### **Proposed Commission Comment:**

If a privately-owned vehicle is used for campaign or officeholder purposes, a candidate committee may issue a reimbursement for mileage at the rate authorized by the State Travel Reimbursement Act or less, but only if the expense is not reimbursed from any other source, and reimbursement must occur within 90 days of the original expenditure for which reimbursement is claimed.

The expenditure should be entered as of the date the check was written to the candidate and include sufficient details to identify that the cost was related to the campaign or duties of office, including the date, total number of miles traveled, and the reimbursement rate used.

*For example* - “Mileage Reimbursement 1st Quarter 2026” is insufficient. “Mileage Reimb. to/from Fundraising Event at Metro Library, 28 miles @ \$.72/mi.” does provide sufficient details.

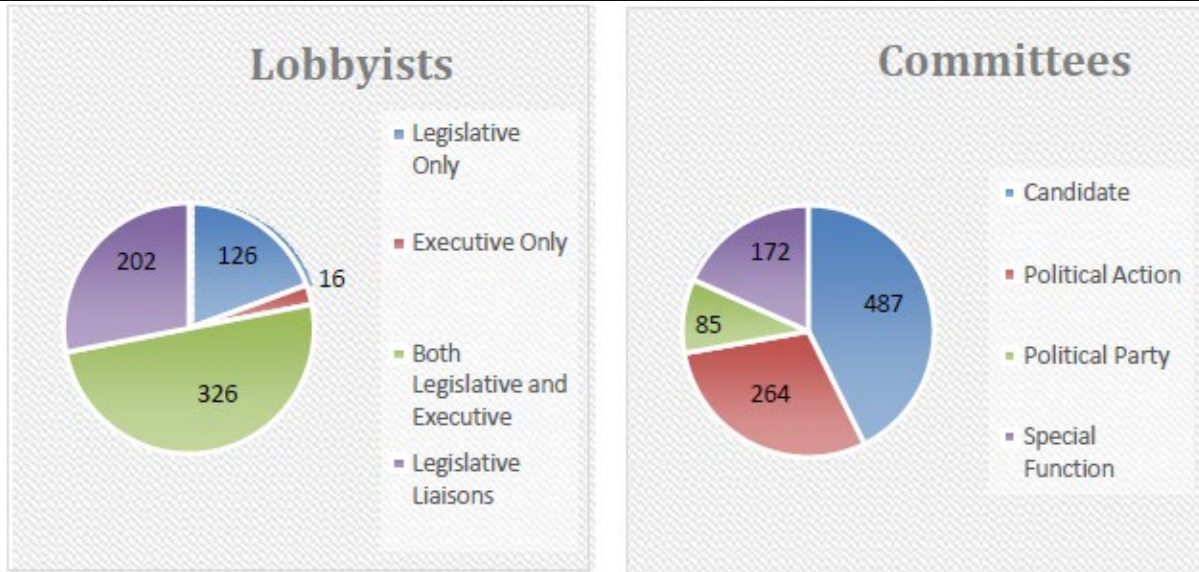
➤ **ERA 2025-06 Modification of Ethics Rule 5.3** : Adding provision for Lobbyist disclosure of “Countries of Particular Concern”

**Annual Registration for Legislative Liaison and Legislative Lobbyist is amended to read as follows:**

“...Information on the registration shall include the legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist’s name, business address, including electronic mail address and business telephone numbers, the name and address of each lobbyist principal by whom the liaison or lobbyist is employed or retained including disclosure of whether each lobbyist principal is a government, political party, individual or entity organized in or with its principal place of business located in a country of particular concern as identified by the US Department of State, and the date of the registration.”

# Compliance Update

## Personal Financial Disclosures: Due May 15, 2026

- As of 4/7/26, almost **45%** of those required to file have already filed their PFDs.
- Of those required to file from the Governor's appointees and Cabinet members, roughly **30%** have filed.

- We will send reminder emails on 4/15, then weekly reminders until the first of May.
- Compliance officers will also call those who have not yet filed once we are within 2 weeks of the final deadline.
- Partnerships with Legislative and Executive leadership worked well last year to reach appointees, and Cabinet, House and Senate members, so we will again ask for assistance from those channels.

# Compliance Update

## Filing Day Engagement & Support Highlights



### ➤ High-Touch Candidate Support at Filing

- **500 candidate interactions** at the Ethics Commission table during filing days
  - **311 filers already registered in Guardian:**
    - reflects strong pre-filing readiness
  - **189 filers assisted with new registrations**
    - direct, real-time onboarding support

### ➤ Broad Reach Across Filing Population

- Of approximately **566 state-level candidates** (excluding federal filers), an estimated:
  - **~90% engagement rate** with the Ethics Commission during filing days
- Only a small subset (~60 candidates) did not connect directly, often due to:
  - Multiple committees/sign-in variations
  - Timing or logistical factors



# Compliance Update

## Filing Day Engagement & Support Highlights

### ▶ Strong Participation in Candidate Training

- Conducted **3 days of live training sessions** during filing week, reaching at least **75 participants – 40% of new filers participated**
  - Attendance remained consistent across multiple days, demonstrating **ongoing demand for compliance education**
  - Time-of-day tracking positions us to **optimize scheduling and expand access** in future cycles

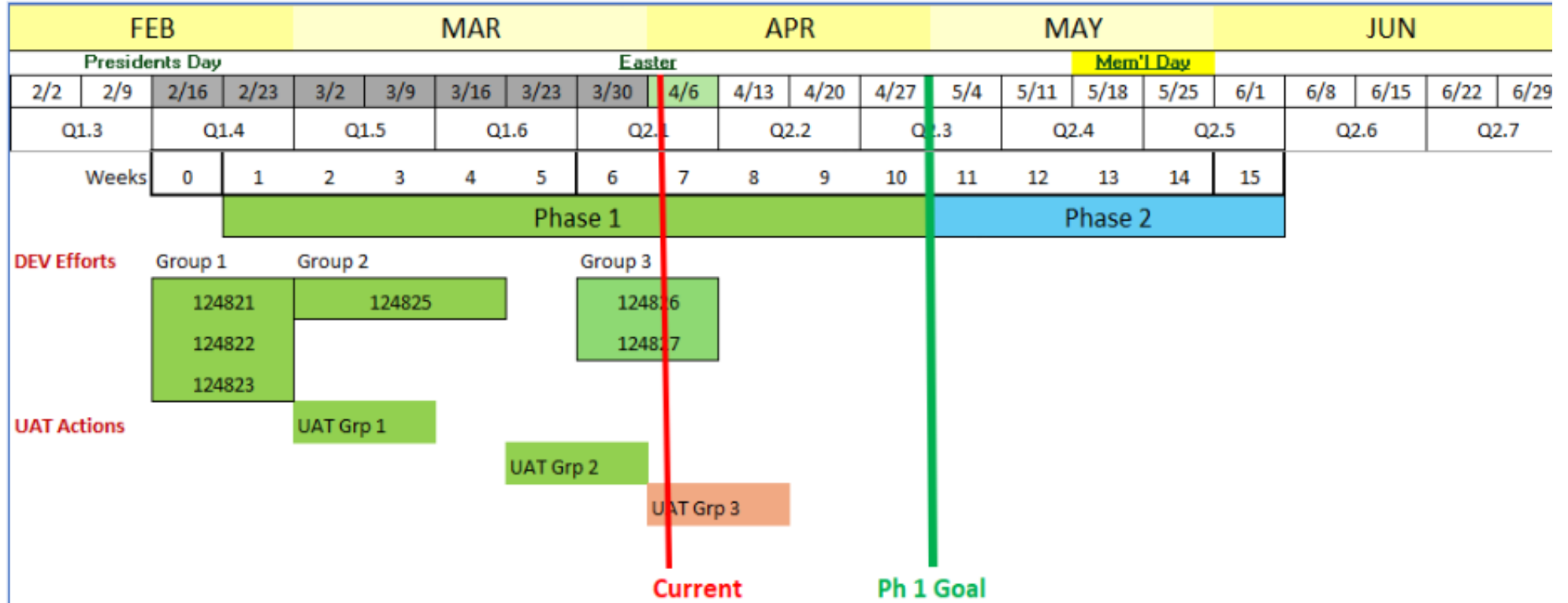

Local Campaign Finance Transparency Portal

The Oklahoma Ethics Commission (OEC) is the state agency that promulgates and enforces rules on campaign finance, initiatives and referenda, lobbying, financial disclosures, as well as conflicts of interest for state officers and employees. This stems from Article XXIX of the Oklahoma Constitution (added by voter initiative in 1990). The Ethics Commission also has enforcement authority over Campaign Finance and Financial Disclosure for counties, certain municipalities, Independent School Districts and Technology Center Districts under 74 O.S. §4262, SB 1745 (2014).

The Ethics Commission is using this interim solution to provide disclosure to citizens of Oklahoma of the submitted local campaign finance reports filed with the OEC until the permanent enhancements in the Guardian system are fully integrated.

# Federal Digital Accessibility Deadline Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Accessibility Requirements

[Final Rule under ADA Title II](#), requiring state and local governments to make websites and applications accessible by **April 24, 2026**

- **Scope:** Covers websites, web/mobile apps, PDFs, videos, audio recordings, all digital content, including social media posts, and academic course content.
  - **Also Includes Guardian:** Embedded third-party tools & vendor-supported services
- **Exemptions:** Archived web content created before April 24, 2026, if maintained for reference only and not updated, may be exempt.
- **Common Accessibility Requirements.** To comply, entities must ensure:
  - **Keyboard Navigation:** Sites must be usable without a mouse.
  - **Text Alternatives (Alt Text):** Descriptions for images, charts, and maps.
  - **Captions:** For all video content.
  - **Color Contrast:** Sufficient contrast for visually impaired users.
  - **Screen Reader Compatibility:** Content must be compatible with assistive technology.
