


The COVID-19 Vaccine among Oklahoma Mothers

Overwhelmingly, mothers reported their doctor, nurse, or other healthcare provider as their MOST trusted source of COVID-19 vaccine information.

PRAMS collects population-based data on maternal attitudes and experiences before, during, and shortly after pregnancy. Around 250 Oklahoma mothers are randomly selected monthly to participate and can respond by mail, phone, or web survey in English or Soanish.

Information included in the birth registry is used to develop analysis weights that adjust for selection probability and non-response. Prevalence rates were calculated using SAS callable SUDAAN. This special issue used 2021 data from a 3-month supplemental survey on the COVID-19 vaccine. The supplement response rate was 50%.

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
