From 2018-2022, **Blaine County** had the **7th highest** drug overdose death rate in the state.



Adults aged 25-44 years** had the highest rate of death.

**Age groups combined because of smaller number of deaths.




NON-HISPANIC WHITE Blaine County residents had the **highest** rate of death.

- Males were **15% more likely** to die than females.
- Drug overdose **death rates increased 39%** from 20.6 per 100,000 (2013-2017) to 28.7 per 100,000 (2018-2022).
- **54%** of people who died had a history of substance use.

Blaine County had the 36th highest nonfatal drug overdose hospitalization rate in the state.

The most common substances involved in hospitalizations were:

▶ Antidepressants

- 40% of hospitalizations were unintentional and 60% due to self harm.
- Drug overdose **hospitalization rates increased 26**% from 59.9 per 100,000 (2017-2019) to 75.7 per 100,000 (2020-2022).
- Non-Hispanic White Blaine County residents had the **highest rate** of hospitalizations.
