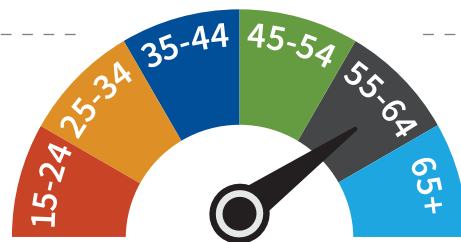

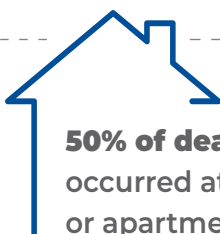

From 2020 to 2024, **Okfuskee County** had the **24th highest** drug overdose death rate in the state.

Residents aged 55-64 had the highest rate of death.



50% of deaths occurred at a home or apartment.

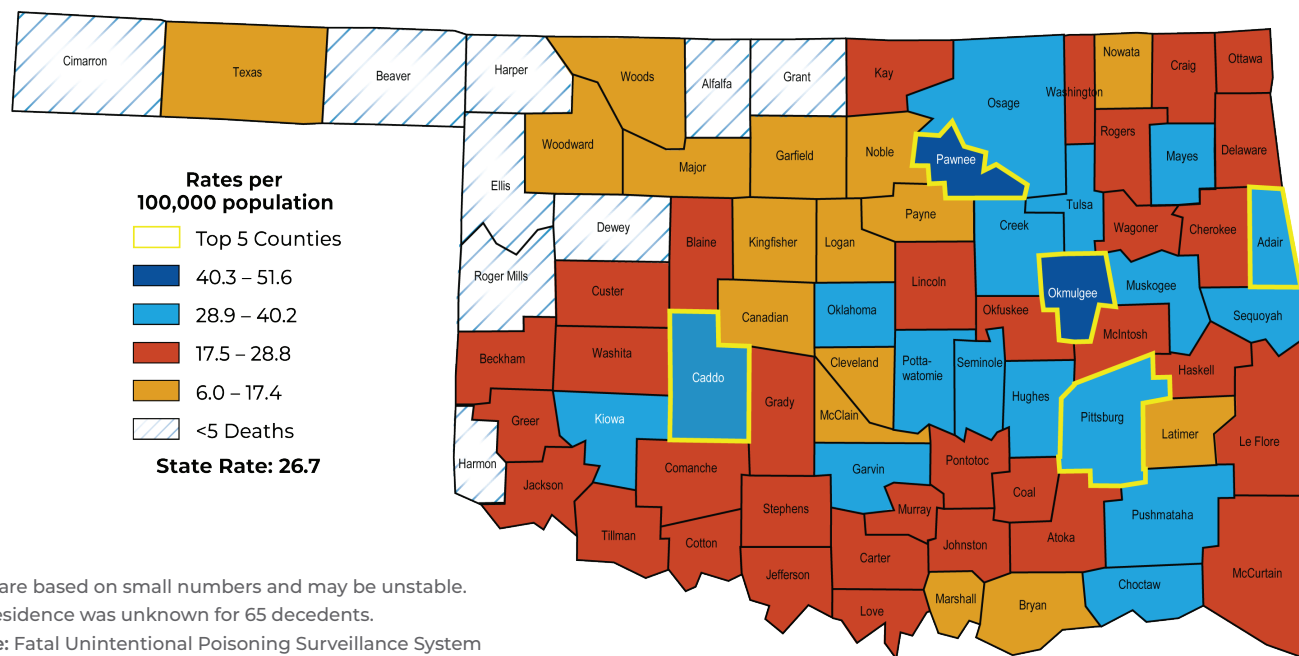


NON-HISPANIC WHITE
Okfuskee County residents had the **highest** rate of death.

- Males were 88% more likely to die than females.
- Drug overdose death rates increased 89% from 14.9 per 100,000 (2015-2019) to 28.2 per 100,000 (2020-2024).
- **69%** of people who died had a history of substance use.

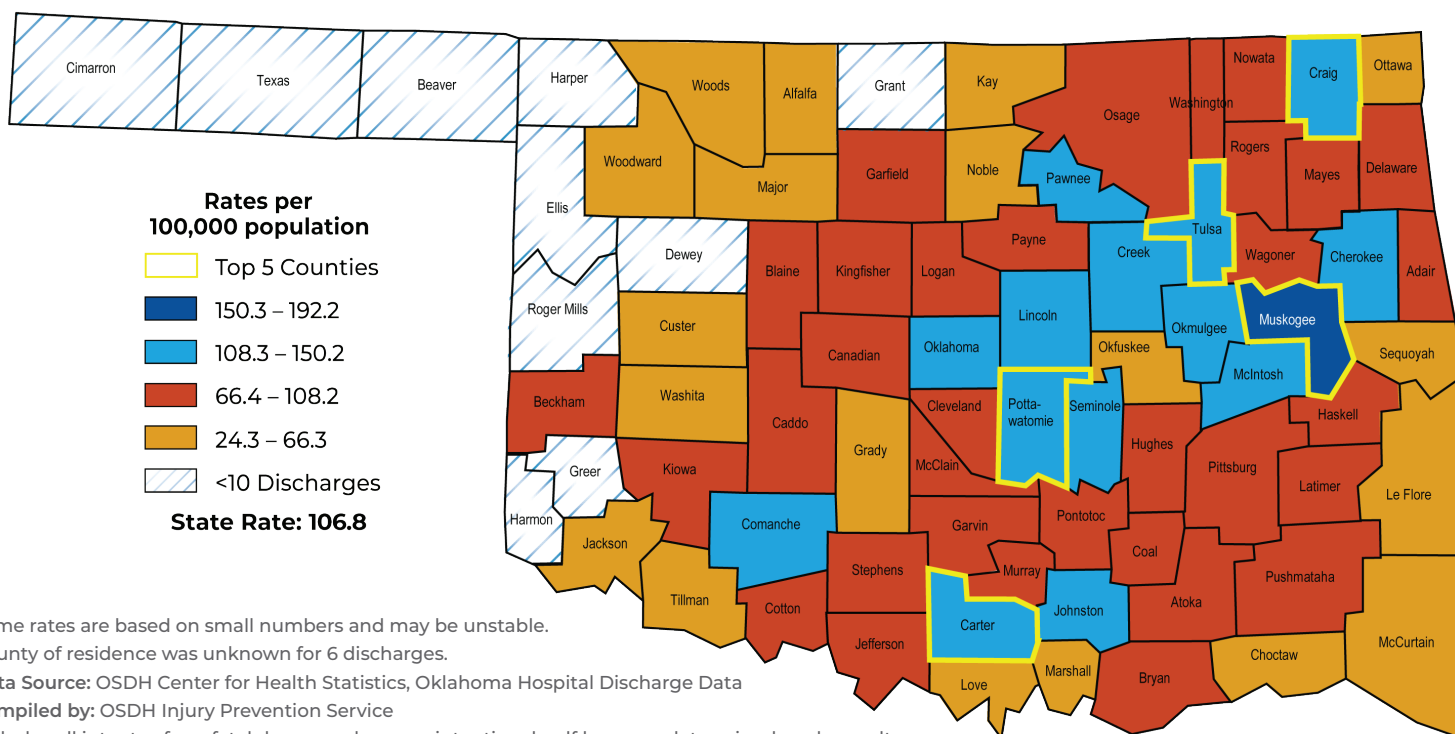
21 Okfuskee County Residents

hospitalized for a nonfatal drug overdose from 2022-2024.

- **57%** of hospitalizations were unintentional.
- Females were 5% more likely to be hospitalized than males.
- Drug overdose discharge rates decreased 40% from 103.1 per 100,000 (2019-2021) to 62.1 per 100,000 (2022-2024).
- Non-Hispanic White Okfuskee County residents had the **highest** rate of hospitalizations.

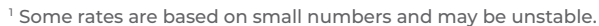
