Presentation: Natural Evolution of Acute MI and PE Care.....Dr. Michael Spain, Saint Francis Hospital Dr. Spain gave a presentation regarding what emergencies can really be handled in a new way in the field and getting them to the cath lab door to balloon within 90 minutes which is the gold standard. The St. Francis Heart Hospital had a 22-minute door to balloon time which is amazing work. The two top killers put out by American Heart Association is cancer and heart disease. Time is what kills a patient now. There are over 700,000 MI's in the United States every year and Ford sells about 700, 000 F-150's every year which puts it in perspective. Every time you see an F-150 on the road, there is a heart attack. A man by the name of Sol Sherry in the 1960's was the first man to treat DVT's with urikinase. Urikinase is produced in the body itself and was the 1st thing found to stop the blood clot. The Acute MI led the way from the progression went from watching and hoping the patient would make it to thrombolytics, to mechanical revascularization and now they are taking the heart completely out and putting in things like Bivacor hearts that have rechargeable batteries. The thicker the plaque in the artery the less chance of rupturing. A person does not have any symptoms until a blockage is over 70%. A person has normal coronary blood flow because the arteries can remodel, dilate, and accommodate, it's not until they get to 70% that they get chest pain and then coronary flow plummets. Anything less than 70% is not stented or operated on, it is treated with medication. Over 50% of heart attacks occur with blockages less than 50%. Saint Francis Muskogee are now doing PE's and Stemi's and they are not just going to Saint Francis Main. These have been very successful so EMS can bring patients here with these patients.
