Describe any plans, if any to change, modify, enhance, or improve funding for ambulance operations:

No plans are currently being considered as to the establishment of a county wide system. The City of Velma is presently reviewing how it will continue to provide service to its citizens. The Cities of Velma and Marlow utilize a sales tax that supports their ambulance service. Marlow uses a contract service with a monthly subsidy and Velma uses a city owned service that utilizes volunteers. City of Comanche uses Meridian Volunteer Fire Department and Contract service from the City of Duncan. Duncan's EMS service is a contract service with no direct cost other than the fees charged for the user of the service. Rural portions of the county are covered by use of the above providers with a slower response time due to the remote locations.

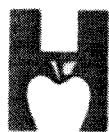

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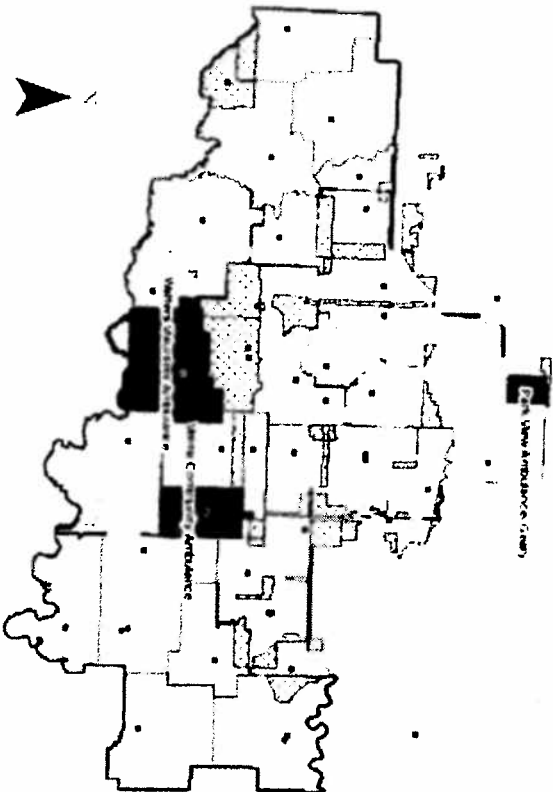
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Region 3 EMS Agency Coverage Areas, Oklahoma 2010
