#### **AGENDA ITEM 1 – ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

Chairman Kristie Fiegen (SD PUC) called the meeting to order, conducted the roll call, and reviewed the agenda. Andrew Lachowsky (AECC) held a proxy for Buddy Hasten, and Loren Ditsch held a proxy for Colton Kennedy.

**MOTION:** To approve minutes from March 22, 2024. Cindy Ireland (APSC) motioned / Shawnee Claiborn-Pinto (PUCT) seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **AGENDA ITEM 2 – STANDING UPDATES**

- a. Resource Adequacy Policy Targets Casey Cathey (SPP Staff) updated the status of Resource Adequacy (RA) policies and targets. Cathey identified areas of emphasis to mitigate RA risk. He indicated that a recommendation for REAL Phase II has not been made, but the next objectives need to be identified and put on the radar, such as how to stabilize policies and recognize LRE challenges with additional risk moving forward. He considered slowing down and identifying longer-term objectives in 2025. Cathey stated that the goal for RR 622 was to be before MOPC in July and to the Board/RSC in August.
- **b. FERC Resource Adequacy** Justin Hinton (SPP Staff) provided an update on recent FERC filings. Hinton indicated that SPP would be filing responses to the protests and comments filed in the ELCC/PBA docket. Hinton also provided an update on the EL23-40 docket and indicated that they were waiting on a FERC Order, but there is no deadline. He also provided a status update on the 206 Complaint docket, which challenges the current accreditation process. FERC issued an order for an extension of time to answer until May 13. He expects comments from other parties defending the current accreditation process.
- c. Supply Adequacy Working Group (SAWG) David Sonntag (WFEC) provided a brief update and indicated SAWG has been working to determine the PRM level, Fuel Assurance, and PBA policies. He indicated that. Sonntag indicated that the vote on PRM and Fuel Assurance failed in the last SAWG meeting. Sonntag will provide updates throughout the day during the various agenda topics.





### **AGENDA ITEMS 3 – SUFFICIENCY VALUATION CURVE**

Charles Hendrix (SPP Staff) provided a refresher on the Sufficiency Valuation Curve. He provided some background on deficiency payment as found in Attachment AA Section 14 and provided examples of the Sufficiency Valuation Curve and its impacts on the Cost of New Entry (CONE) payments.

#### AGENDA ITEM 4 – RR 621 - FUEL ASSURANCE

Chris Haley (SPP Staff) provided an update on the current discussion related to Fuel Assurance policies. Haley noted that RR 621 had been updated based on the latest SAWG meeting. He reviewed the results of the straw poll that was taken at the last SAWG meeting and noted that the language in the revised RR reflects Option 4A, which was reviewed during his presentation. He reviewed the EFORd and EFOF Winter Season impacts, reflecting the most recent data available for various scenarios, including Option 4A.

# AGENDA ITEM 5 – RR 622 – PLANNING RESERVE MARGIN (PRM)

Chris Haley (SPP Staff) provided a refresher on the LOLE study assumptions and presented an update on the status of the PRM winter and summer policy development. Haley addressed questions regarding Base PRM vs. ACAP PRM. He identified the biggest hurdle with the proposal as the transition mechanism. Casey Cathey (SPP Staff) further discussed the PRM results at varying LOLE levels.

A straw poll was conducted to provide direction to SAWG for the development of RR 621 and RR 622 policies. These questions resulted in a robust discussion. The results are as follows:
