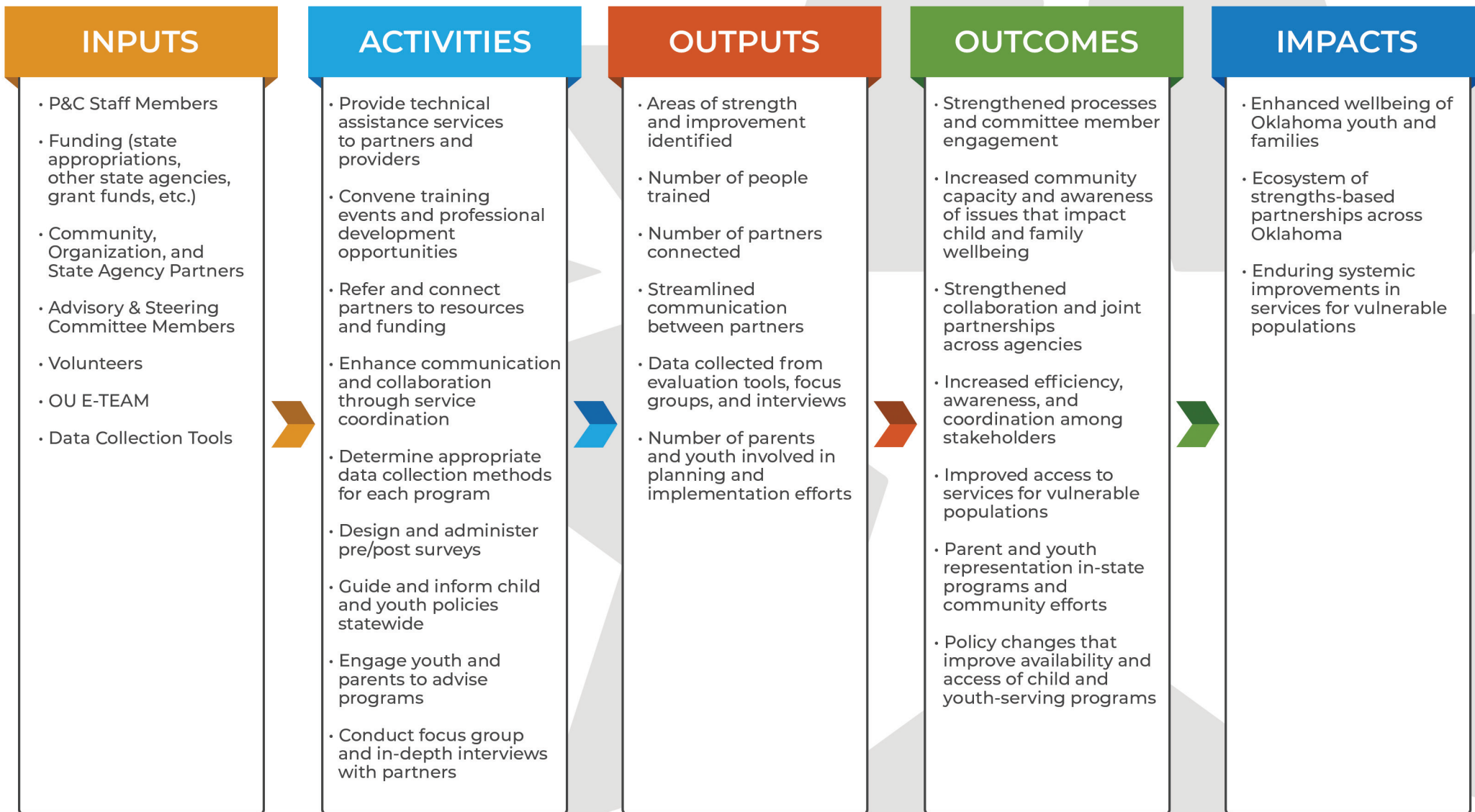


The Office of Planning and Coordination
