## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

Pursuant to Section 447.205 of Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) is required to provide public notice of its intent to submit a state plan amendment (SPA) to modify its methods and standards for setting payment rates for services. An Indian Health Services, Tribal, and Urban Indian (I/T/U) notice was sent to inform tribal partners of the proposed change on December 1, 2025.

## **Mental Health Transportation Rate Increase**

OHCA, in partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) will seek approval of a State Plan amendment to increase the reimbursement rate for secure mental health transportation as follows:

• For transport over 30 miles the rate will increase from \$160.00 per encounter plus \$2.85 per mile, to \$160 per encounter plus \$4.80 per mile.

The estimated budget impact for SFY 2026 (7 months) will be an increase in the total amount of \$126,782; with \$27,892 in the state share. For SFY 2027, the increased total is estimated to be \$217,341 with \$47,815 in the state share. This proposed change will be heard before the OHCA State Plan Amendment Rate Committee (SPARC) hearing on January 12, 2026 at 10:00 AM and the OHCA Board meeting on January 21, 2026, at 2:00 PM.

Effective date: December 1, 2025, contingent upon CMS approval.
