Summary

Purpose:

To provide guidelines to assure medical necessity and consistency in the prior authorization process.

Definitions

Sleep Positioning Systems: are cushions, foam-covered brackets or other forms of contouring which are used with or without a specialized mattress to maintain the body in a constant position during sleep and rest.

Sleep positioning systems include, but are not limited to:

- Jenx Dreama
- Leckey Sleepform
- Symmetrisleep
- Chailey Lying Support
- JCM Moonlight
- Smirthwaite Snoooooze
- Posture Care Ltd Hugga
- Medifab
- Megalong Positioning Services

Durable Medical Equipment (DME): means equipment that can withstand repeated use (e.g. a type of item that could normally be rented), is used to serve a medical purpose, is not useful to a person in the absence of an illness or injury, and is used in the most appropriate setting, including the home or workplace.

Information

Sleep positioning systems are not considered primarily medical in nature and are not considered medically necessary.

Sleep positioning systems are ineligible for coverage as they do not meet the definition of durable medical equipment as outlined in OHCA policy 317:30-5-211.1.
