

ANALYSIS OF **Obesity** in Oklahoma's SoonerCare Program

SoonerCare Members


In SFY2022, the number of SoonerCare members diagnosed with obesity increased to 4.4% of all members and 11.0% of all adult members. These are likely underestimates, as BMI/weight diagnosis codes are not used as often as expected.

In SFY2022 there were **58,639** members diagnosed with obesity, or 4.4% of all members







Members Diagnosed with Obesity by Age Group SFY2022



Prevalence Rates

Prevalence 1.0-1.9% 2.0-2.9%


3.0-3.9%4.0% or Greater

The majority of counties in Oklahoma had a prevalence rate of obesity between 3% and 4%. Alfalfa (8.0%) and Pittsburg (7.6%) counties had the highest rates.

Reimbursement Cost


Members diagnosed with obesity made up 4.4% of all SoonerCare members in SFY2022. However, the total reimbursement for services rendered for members diagnosed with obesity represented 11.0% of reimbursements paid in SFY2022.

The graph below further illustrates how the percentage of reimbursement for services rendered for members diagnosed with obesity exceeded the prevalence of obesity for the past several state fiscal years.

Annual Reimbursement for Members Diagnosed with Obesity SFY2013 - SFY2022




SoonerCare Members Diagnosed with Obesity: Percent of Total Reimbursement Compared to Percent of Total SoonerCare Enrollment
