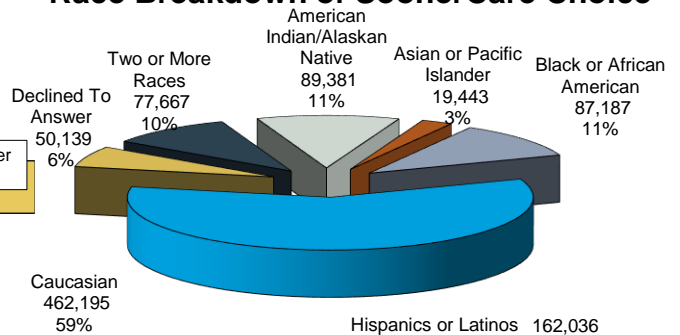

Race Breakdown of SoonerCare Choice



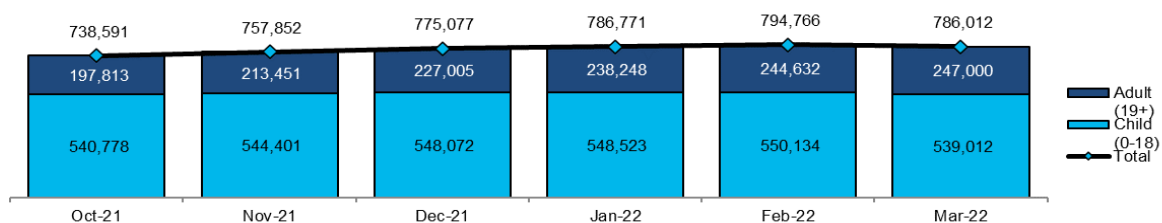
