




# SoonerSelect

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) contracted with three plans to deliver medical services to SoonerSelect members. Each health plan is required to provide the same set of core medical services that are provided to SoonerCare members today. Each SoonerSelect health plan also offers extra services, called value-added benefits.

The chart below shows the value-added benefits each plan offers. They may help you determine which health plan will best meet your needs.
