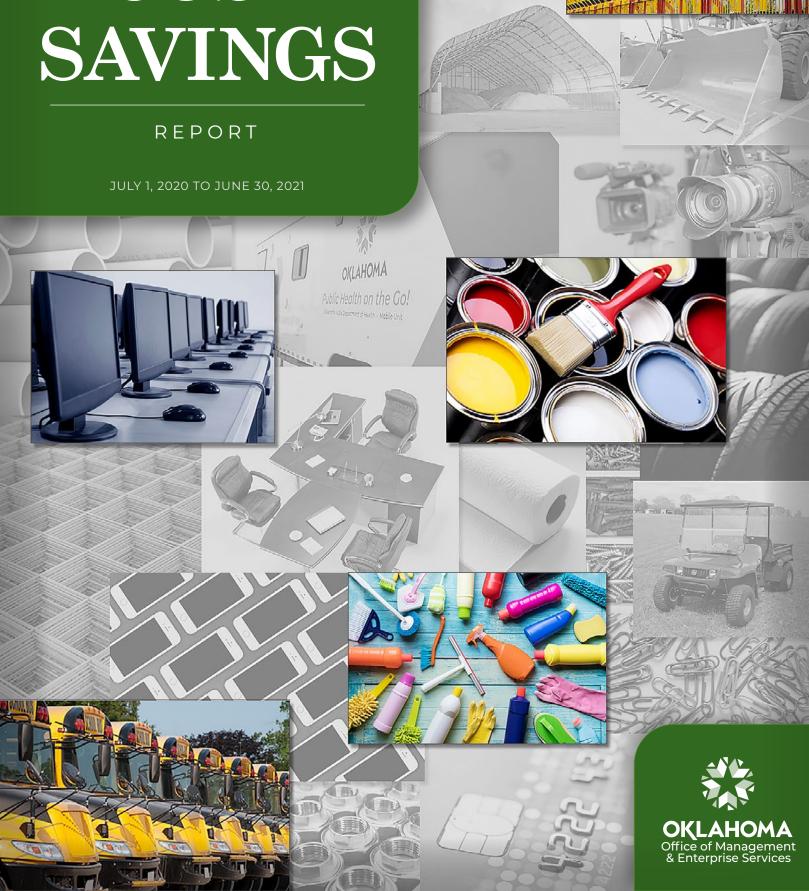

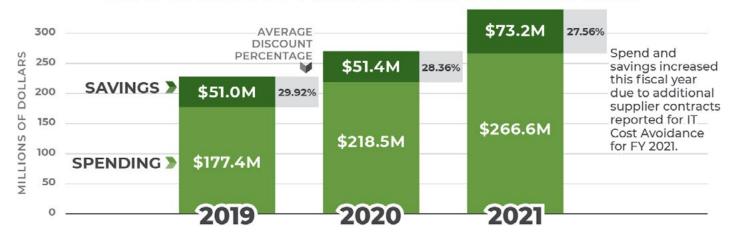
#### TOTAL IMPACT BY STATE PROCUREMENT



#### **NON-IT SAVINGS BY STATEWIDE CONTRACT**



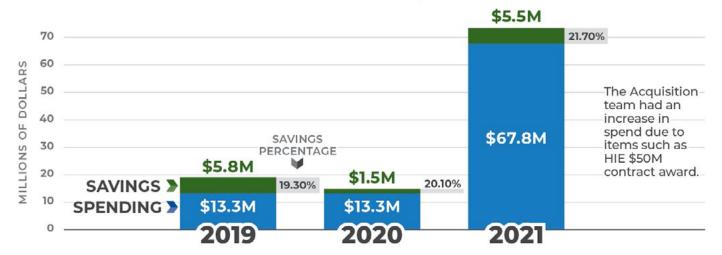
# INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY STATEWIDE CONTRACT COST AVOIDANCE



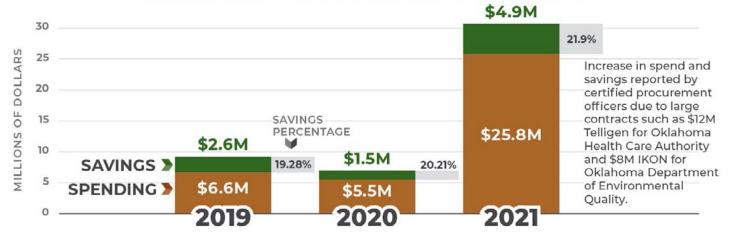
# **NON-IT ACQUISITION TEAM SAVINGS**

#### PRODUCT AND SERVICE CONTRACTS

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The State of Oklahoma realized savings in excess of \$54 million for fiscal year 2021 through managed contracts of products and services other than information technology. Twenty-four of 112 statewide contracts are currently being tracked for cost savings. Savings for the 24 statewide contracts are summarized below:

Spend and savings are based on 24 of the 112 statewide contracts (excluding information technology). The 24 statewide contracts represent 69.10% of the total amount spent of all contracts.

#### **Notes regarding cost-savings calculations**

Simplified cost savings and cost avoidance formulas were used to calculate savings percentage.

- (Historical Price New Price) / (Historical Price)
- (Average of Responsive Bids Awarded Bid) / (Average of Responsive Bids)
- (MSRP Sales) / MSRP, and then total all averages for the new contract savings percentage.

Savings calculations are conservative and represent only savings which can be easily quantified.

Several issues led OMES to take a very conservative approach to calculating savings. Those issues include:

- Incomplete usage data as reported by suppliers for each contract.
- Multiple discount percentages across a specific contract in which OMES would have taken the discount with the least percentage off of list prices.

#### STATE PURCHASING CARD

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

A state purchase card is a form of credit card issued to designated state and political subdivision employees. The Legislature authorized the Purchase Card (P-card) Program in 1998, which was rolled out in 2000 with use beginning in fiscal year 2001. The P-card program was created to provide an efficient process to state agencies and political subdivisions when making single transaction purchases. At that time the single purchase limit was \$250 and was used for very limited, urgent needs. As the program has gained momentum, expansion has included raising the single transaction limit up to \$25,000 with the approval of the State Purchasing Director and with certain statutory transactions within Title 74 Section 85.5a.D. having no transactional limits. The P-card is used by the cardholder to make purchases of most types of goods and services necessary for official use of the state. Personal purchases are prohibited. The objective of the program is to simplify and reduce paperwork necessary for agency purchases by placing P-cards in the hands of trained employees who actually utilize the goods and services purchased.

Advantages achieved through use of the state P-card program include:

- Simplifying and expediting purchasing processes.
- Rebates to participating agencies.
- Reduced transaction times and transaction costs.
- Prompt payment to merchants.
- · Audit trail.
- Expanded number of business-to-business or private entity sales with the state.
- P-card may result in discounts.
