2026 Legislation:

HB 2237: Requires employees of licensed medical marijuana dispensaries to apply for and receive medical marijuana credentials from the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority that authorizes the employee to work as a medical marijuana consultant within the dispensary and requires successful completion from a credentialing and training program approved by the Authority; and requires employees provide proof of being twenty-one years of age or older. Authored by Rep. Cyndi Munson **CARRIED OVER**

HB 2384: Expands the membership of the Impaired Driving Prevention Advisory Committee to include the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority, State Commissioner of Health, Director of Department of Transportation and Executive Director of the State Board of Pharmacy. Authored by Rep. Brian Hill **CARRIED OVER**

HB 3013 (2026): Adds specific pesticides and allowable thresholds to required testing for final harvest batch and final production batch samples. Authored by Rep. Jacob Rosecrants.

HB 3143 (2026): Extends the moratorium on new medical marijuana businesses until August 2028 and prohibits the sale or transfer of an existing license if that license is currently subject to an investigation for any action which could result in revocation. Authored by Rep. Rusty Cornwell.

HB 3144 (2026): Places a cap of 2,550 total medical marijuana commercial grower licenses in the state. Authored by Rep. Rusty Cornwell.

HB 3355 (2026): Amends medical marijuana statutory language. Authored by Rep. Danny Williams.

HB 3317 (2026): Removes individuals on Medicaid/SoonerCare from qualifying for reduced patient license fees. Authored by Rep. Ryan Eaves.

HB 3519 (2026): Requires medical marijuana grower applicants to pay a \$2,000 land reclamation fee, exempts applicants that have owned the land for at least five years, creates a revolving fund to be used for environmental remediation and removes the commercial grower bond requirement. Authored by Rep. T.J. Marti.

HB 4454 (2026): Limits edible medical marijuana products to 10 mg THC per serving and 100 mg THC per package total; limits beverages to 20 mg THC per container and restricts edibles that may be attractive to children. Authored by Rep. Carl Newton.

SB 191: Prohibits medical marijuana businesses from engaging in advertising that suggests ingestion of marijuana is safe or harmless and places enhanced restrictions on other advertising and decoration of medical marijuana dispensaries and prohibits discounts or coupons for the purchase of medical marijuana products. Authored by Sen. Dusty Deever **CARRIED OVER**

SB 205: Authorizes the Medical Marijuana Authority to issue research licenses to facilitate the collection and analysis of patient data and outcomes. Authored by Sen. Shane Jett **CARRIED OVER**

SB 320: Places a weekly limit on medical marijuana purchases by licensed medical marijuana patients to 2.5 ounces per week. Authored by Sen. George Burns **CARRIED OVER**

SB 332: Modifies the annual medical marijuana dispensary license fee from 10% of the combined annual state sales tax and excise tax during the previous twelve months to \$4,500 per year. Authored by Sen. Bill Coleman **CARRIED OVER**

SB 498: Requires all medical marijuana licensure revocation hearings be conducted in accordance with the Oklahoma Pleading Code. Authored by Sen. Mary Boren **CARRIED OVER**

SB 522: Directs the Medical Marijuana Advisory Council to organize a task force on purchase and possession limits for medical marijuana patients and to provide related recommendations. Authored by Bill Coleman **CARRIED OVER**

SB 534: Permits medical marijuana transportation license holders to transport medical marijuana from a retailer to patients. Authored by Sen. Jonathan Wingard **CARRIED OVER**

SB 640: Increases the distance between medical marijuana dispensaries and schools from 1,000 ft to 3,000 ft. Authored by Sen. Lonnie Paxton **CARRIED OVER**

SB 643: Prohibits medical marijuana business ownership by nonresidents of the state. Authored by Sen. Lonnie Paxton **CARRIED OVER**

SB 1092: Requires all licensed medical marijuana growers to submit an odor control plan on or before January 1, 2027, to include specific facility information, facility odor emissions information, and odor mitigation best management practices; and requires a business to submit an odor control plan to the Authority if the business receives three or more odor nuisance complaints within a 30-day period. Authored by Sen. Brian Guthrie **CARRIED OVER**

SB 1104: Requires the state seed-to-sale inventory tracking system include a software infrastructure that provides maximum flexibility for the exchange of data between the Authority and businesses; capabilities that allow businesses to submit data to the Authority directly through an application program interface (API), data interchange service tool, or by other means or technology acceptable to the Authority; automated reporting for inventory and point of sale discrepancies; and technology for payments, sales and tax collection. SB 1242 (2026): Increases the minimum bond required for commercial growers to \$100,000. Authored by Sen. Warren Hamilton.

SB 1305 (2026): Authorizes third-party vendors meeting specific requirements to provide educational training courses for credentialed employees; requires the Authority to approve or deny a vendor's application within thirty days. Authored by Sen. Bill Coleman.

SB 1352 (2026): Allows specific COO applications to qualify for a grace period upon denial, provided they were submitted before February 1, 2024. Authored by Sen. Jack Stewart.

SB 1364 (2026): Requires businesses to disclose outstanding state fees, fines, taxes or other debts, and directs OMMA to develop an attestation form. Authored by Sen. Mark Mann.

SB 1499 (2026): Requires the OMMA Executive Director to be hired by, report to, and be removed or replaced with cause by the OMMA EAC. Authored by Sen. Carri Hicks.

SB 1501 (2026): Defines "reclamation," directs OMMA to keep record of all bond statuses for at least two years, and requires OMMA to notify law enforcement agencies upon the expiration of a medical marijuana business license. Authored by Sen. Darcy Jech.

SB 1508 (2026): Creates the Compassionate Access to Medical Marijuana Act which establishes standards for terminally ill patients in hospitals who are valid Medical Marijuana recipients to continue to access marijuana products. Authored by Carri Hicks

SB 1591 (2026): Limits edible medical marijuana products to no more than 10 mg of THC per serving and 100 mg per package. Authored by Sen. Paul Rosino.

HB 1750: Prohibits intentional marijuana use by a pregnant woman with a medical marijuana patient license. Authored by Rep. Anthony Moore **CARRIED OVER**

SB 1822 (2026): Authorizes OMMA to issue a \$500 research license to eligible institutions and businesses to study and report on patient-reported outcomes related to medical marijuana and directs OMMA to promulgate rules. Authored by Sen. Shane Jett.

HB 1163: Decreases the weight amount of marijuana needed for an aggravated trafficking offense from 1,000 to 100 pounds and states that possession of 1.5 oz of flower by persons who can state a medical condition at the time of a traffic stop and issuance of a written citation or arrest, but are not in possession of a medical marijuana patient license, shall be a misdemeanor offence punishable by a fine of up to \$400. Authored by Rep. Tom Gann. **CARRIED OVER**

HB 1714: Prohibits employer discrimination in the initial hiring for employment if the discrimination is based upon a person's use of cannabis off the job and away from the workplace. Authored by Rep. Forrest Bennett **CARRIED OVER**

HB 2057: Modifies the medical marijuana taxation apportionment to lower the amount the Health Department receives and provide it to the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund instead. Authored by Rep. Mark Chapman **CARRIED OVER**

HB 2170: Modifies various provisions related to revenue and taxation, transfers the duties associated with registered agent fees to the Secretary of State, and authorizes the imposition and retention of certain fees. Authored by John Pfeiffer **CARRIED OVER**

HB 3018 (2026): Excludes marijuana, marijuana derivatives or synthetic cannabinoids from certain restrictions on operating a motor vehicle while under the influence. Authored by Rep. Andy Fugate.

HB 3127 (2026): Updates language regarding medical marijuana use and expands the rights of employers regarding employee or applicant use of marijuana. Authored by Rep. Kevin West.

HB 3314 (2026): Authorizes counties to levy a public service impact tax on retail medical marijuana sales and outlines the specific process. Authored by Rep. Ryan Eaves.

SB 1257 (2026): Amends the definition of marijuana and tetrahydrocannabinols in the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act. Authored by Sen. Warren Hamilton.

SB 1846 (2026): Authorizes counties and municipalities to levy excise taxes on medical marijuana sales and outlines specific requirements. Authored by Sen. Dusty Deevers.

SB 2053 (2026): Authorizes counties to levy an additional tax of up to 10% on retail medical marijuana sales for public safety and infrastructure purposes and outlines specific requirements. Authored by Sen. Dave Rader.

SB 2092 (2026): Authorizes the ABLE Commission to supervise, inspect and regulate hemp beverages. Authored by Sen. Lonnie Paxton.

HB 2118: Amends multiple sections of law relating to the Military Department, prohibits any member of the state military forces from knowingly using or ingesting marijuana or any substances or products derived from marijuana, including hemp, tetrahydrocannabinol and cannabidiol. Authored by Rep. Chris Kannady. **CARRIED OVER**

HB 2176: Allows the OTC to retain a fee of 1.5% of the gross collection proceeds on medical marijuana excise tax. Authored by Rep. John Pfeiffer **CARRIED OVER**

HB 2737: Adds the use of medical marijuana by a pregnant woman to the definition of neglect. Authored by Rep. Gerrid Kendrix **CARRIED OVER**

HB 3767 (2026): Adds specified substances to Schedule I and Schedule IV under the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act. Authored by Tim Turner

HB 4248 (2026): Prohibits the sale of any beverage containing hemp to persons under 21 years of age. Authored by Chris Kannady

SB 23: Prohibits the smoking of tobacco, marijuana, and the use of a vapor product in a motor vehicle while in the presence of a minor. Authored by Sen. Brenda Stanley **CARRIED OVER**

SB 39: Prohibits the carry and use of firearms while under the influence of medical marijuana and adjusts the provisions related to the Self-Defense Act to allow persons legally licensed to use medical marijuana to qualify for a handgun license. Authored by Sen. Julie Daniels **CARRIED OVER**

SB 133: Requires any person intending to use groundwater for a medical marijuana grow facility to present to OWRB a valid medical marijuana commercial grower license issued by OMMA. Authored by Sen. George Burns **CARRIED OVER**

SB 1125: Authorizes counties and municipalities to levy an excise tax upon the sale of medical marijuana on the gross proceeds or gross receipts from all sales within the county or municipality, requires any tax be approved by a majority of the registered votes before the tax may be levied and outlines further details, and automatically extends the provisions of this legislation to apply to recreational marijuana if legalized under Oklahoma state law.
