Introduction

On September 1, 1973, the OSBI assumed the statewide administration of the UCR Program in Oklahoma. When the OSBI began administering the program, there were approximately 260 agencies reporting their crime statistics to the OSBI. As of December 31, 2022, there are 452 local law enforcement agencies reporting crime statistics, and the OSBI subsequently submits this crime data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

Traditionally, the FBI's UCR Program accepted data via the Summary Reporting System (SRS). However, as of January 1, 2021, the FBI transitioned from SRS data to incident-based reporting data compatible with the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). With the changes at the federal level, local law enforcement agencies in Oklahoma transitioned from submitting their crime data to the OSBI via SRS to submitting data into Oklahoma's State Incident-Based Reporting System (SIBRS), which the OSBI maintains in addition to the SRS.

In the SRS data collection, data was collected for only eight crimes and included a Hierarchy Rule to determine which offense was reported when an incident involved more than one offense. For example, if a Murder and an Aggravated Assault occurred in a single incident, the Hierarchy Rule determines that only the Murder is reported into the SRS database. In contrast, the incident-based reporting system collects data for 52 unique Group A offenses and 11 Group B offenses, and instead of using a Hierarchy Rule, NIBRS/SIBRS allows reporting of up to 10 offenses in a single incident. Additionally, the SIBRS data collection is capable of linking an arrest directly to an incident, and the reporting agency can specify if the crime was attempted or completed. Overall, the SIBRS data collection gathers more detailed information on each incident's victim(s), offense(s), and offender(s). Examples of more detailed information include but are not limited to: victim-to-offender relationships, drug types, premise types, and property stolen and/or damaged.

Beginning with [Crime in Oklahoma, 2021](#), the annual report will use data reported to the SIBRS database. This report includes data reported for 52 Group A offenses and 11 Group B offenses. If you would like more information, please contact the SAC at okcrimestats@osbi.ok.gov.

Legislative Mandate

The *Crime in Oklahoma* report includes information provided by law enforcement agencies for known offenses. The Oklahoma Legislature mandated the responsibility and authority for data collection and dissemination to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. Requirements established through [Title 74 O.S. § 150.10](#) are as follows:

- A. A uniform crime reporting system shall be established by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The Director shall have the power and duty, when directed by the Commission, to collect and gather such information from such state agencies as may be prescribed in Section 150.1, et seq. of this title.
- B. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation is hereby designated as the agency which shall collect, gather, assemble, and collate such information as is prescribed by this section.
- C.
 1. All state, county, city and town law enforcement agencies shall submit reports to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation on form prescribed by the Bureau. The reports shall contain the number and nature of offenses committed within their respective jurisdictions, the disposition of such matters, and such other information as the Bureau may require, respecting information relating to the cause and prevention of crime, recidivism, the rehabilitation of criminals and the proper administration of criminal justice.
 2. Any information taken from such information, data, records or reports submitted to the uniform crime reporting system and used to prepare the Uniform Crime Report shall be an open record pursuant to the Oklahoma Open Records Act. Requests for such information shall be submitted to the Bureau.
 3. Any request under the Oklahoma Open Records Act for any other information, data, records or reports submitted to the uniform crime reporting system by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall be directed to the Bureau pursuant to Section 24A.20 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such information, data, records or reports shall be considered investigative records of the Bureau and shall be subject to discovery and disclosure only in compliance with Section 150.5 of this title or other applicable statute.

4. Any requests under the Oklahoma Open Records Act for more information, data, records or reports submitted by a law enforcement agency other than the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to the uniform crime reporting system shall be directed to the law enforcement agency submitting the information, data, records or reports to the Bureau unit pursuant to Section 24A.20 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such information, data records or reports shall be considered law enforcement records and shall be subject to discovery and disclosure only in compliance with Section 24A.8 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes or other applicable statute.

- D. Upon receipt of such information the Director shall have such data collated and formulated and shall compile statistics as the Director may deem necessary in order to present a proper classification and analysis of the volume and nature of crime and the administration of criminal justice within this state.
- E. Refusal or persistent failure of any law enforcement agency to submit reports required by this section may result in discontinued access to Bureau information and assistance.

Statement of Policy

The following regulations will be observed by this agency concerning the release of statistical information. Employees of the agency will observe these procedures and will not deviate from this policy without the express consent of the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. All information to be released will originate from the Field Services Unit of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.

Policy:

1. This agency will publish an annual report reflecting crime in Oklahoma. This report will be distributed to the Governor, members of the Legislature, the Attorney General, law enforcement agencies, the State Library System, and to any agency or committee dedicated to law enforcement or criminal justice work. An electronic copy of the report will be made available on the OSBI website.
2. Published annual reports will be released to the above-named agencies at no charge. They will then be released to individuals or agencies extraneous to the criminal justice community who shall pay a fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for every copy received.
3. Data Requests
 - a. Information contained in the published annual report may be released via telephone, letter, etc. to any interested party.
 - b. All requests for unpublished information from the agencies or individuals extraneous to the criminal justice community should be submitted to the Statistical Analysis Center (SAC). In accordance with the Oklahoma Open Records Act, all requests may be subject to a charge. Standard practice is to provide data in a PDF or hard copy format to prevent manipulation of data. Exceptions to this practice can be submitted to the director of the SAC for consideration.
 - c. Law enforcement agencies may receive interim, unpublished, specialized reports identifying their agency only, provided the request is reasonable. Law enforcement agencies may also receive their respective county totals along with other state or regional totals. All requests should be directed to the supervisor of the Field Services Unit.

Reporting and Collection Procedures

As described in the [Legislative Mandate](#) section, all state, county, city and town law enforcement agencies are required to submit crime data to the OSBI. Law enforcement agencies report the number of known offenses for Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, Crimes Against Society, and Group B offenses. Crime counts include “actual offenses known” without regard to (1) whether anyone is arrested for the crime; (2) whether the stolen property is recovered; (3) the local prosecution policy; and (4) any other restrictive considerations. Law enforcement agencies also report clearance data either by an arrest or by exceptional means (a crime solution or clearance recorded when some element beyond law enforcement control precludes the placing of formal charges against the offender(s)). This report contains demographic information for victims (where applicable) and arrestees.

Objectives:

The fundamental objectives of the Oklahoma UCR/SIBRS Program are:

1. Inform the Governor, Legislature, other governmental officials, and the public as to the nature, magnitude, and trends of crime in Oklahoma.
2. Provide law enforcement administrators with statistics for administrative and operational use.
3. Provide offender demographics in order to find the proper focus for crime prevention and law enforcement.
4. Provide data and statistics for research to improve the efficiency, effectiveness, and performance of criminal justice agencies.
5. Provide the FBI with complete incident-based reporting data to be included in the national publication Crime in the United States.

Verification:

A primary consideration in the collection of criminal statistics in Oklahoma is the uniformity and accuracy of crime data. While the Field Services Unit (FSU) at OSBI provides training and technical assistance to local law enforcement, the accuracy of crime data included in this report cannot be guaranteed. Incident reports uploaded from external records management systems must meet the state’s minimum requirements for submission before being accepted into the state repository. Incident reports that are not validated are not included in this report. Throughout the year, FSU representatives work with reporting agencies to correct reporting errors. Ongoing communication (phone, email, and in person) with reporting agencies is essential to ensure the accuracy and quality of reporting.

Crime Factors:

This report includes data reported to the OSBI through the State Incident-Based Reporting System (SIBRS) as of April 5-6, 2023. Due to SIBRS being a live database, data could be subject to change if queried after April 5-6, 2023. Data provided in this report is based on offenses known to law enforcement; however, victims do not always report crime to law enforcement. For that reason, the OSBI cautions against using the data reported to make direct comparisons among jurisdictions in the State or Nation. Offense data is reported for an event which may include several offenses, multiple offenders, and/or multiple victims. As a result, direct comparisons between offense, arrest, and victim data may be misleading. Individuals involved in an incident could be linked to multiple crimes as well. Additionally, other factors may influence the amount of crime reported across jurisdictions, including:

- Population density and urbanization
- Compositions of the population, particularly in references to age
- Relative stability of population, especially concerning commuting patterns
- Transportation and highways
- Socioeconomic conditions, such as median household income, poverty, and unemployment
- Culture factors: education, recreational, and religious makeup
- Family dynamics and structure
- Climate
- Effective strength of local law enforcement
- The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency
- Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts
- Public opinion toward crime
- Crime reporting practices of victims and citizens.

Counting Methodology

As previously mentioned, SIBRS is a more complex data collection, and as a result, there are a multitude of ways to count data submitted. For that reason, the SAC has outlined methodology below for how data in this report was counted.

For crime reporting purposes, the total number of crimes are counted in the following way:

- Crimes Against Persons are counted by the number of **unique** victims of a crime against a person.
- Crimes Against Property are counted by the number of **unique** crimes against property offense types, with the exception of Motor Vehicle Thefts. Motor Vehicles Thefts are counted by the number of **attempted** Motor Vehicle Thefts plus the number of **unique** motor vehicles stolen.
- Crimes Against Society are counted by the number of **unique** crimes against society offense types.
- Group B offenses are counted by the number of **unique** offenders of a Group B offense who had an arrest date in the calendar year of 2022. While the individual may have been arrested in 2022, the incident could have occurred in a previous year.

The numbers in each section may differ dependent on the data element. Below are brief descriptions for how specific data element were counted:

- Month, Day of Week, Time of Day are counted in the same manner as listed above for each crime category.
- Victim specific information such as victim type, demographics, relationship types, and injury types are counted by the **unique** victim.
- Arrestee information (i.e., demographics) are counted in the same manner as described above for Group B crimes.
- Offense specific information such as weapon type, premise type, and criminal/gang activity are counted by each unique offense type regardless of crime category.
- Property loss, value, and type are counted by the **unique** property item.

Figure 1. Number of Murder & Non-Negligent Manslaughter Crimes per Month

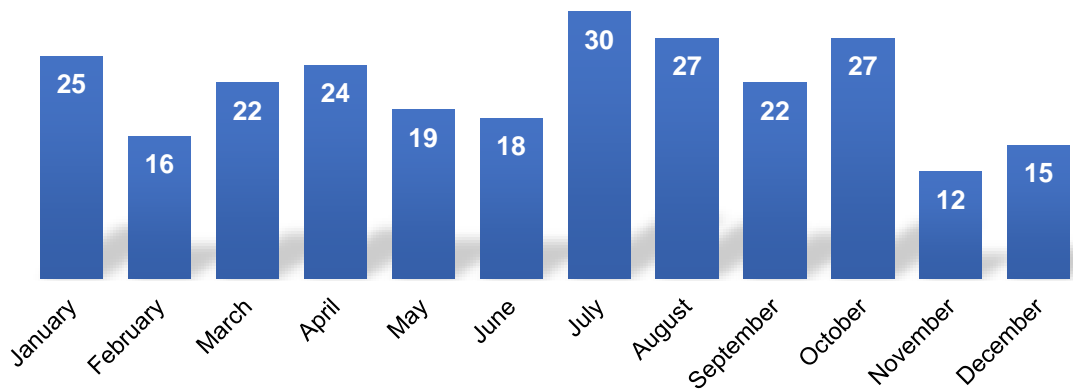


Figure 2. Number of Murder & Non-Negligent Manslaughter Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 3. Number of Negligent Manslaughter Crimes per Month

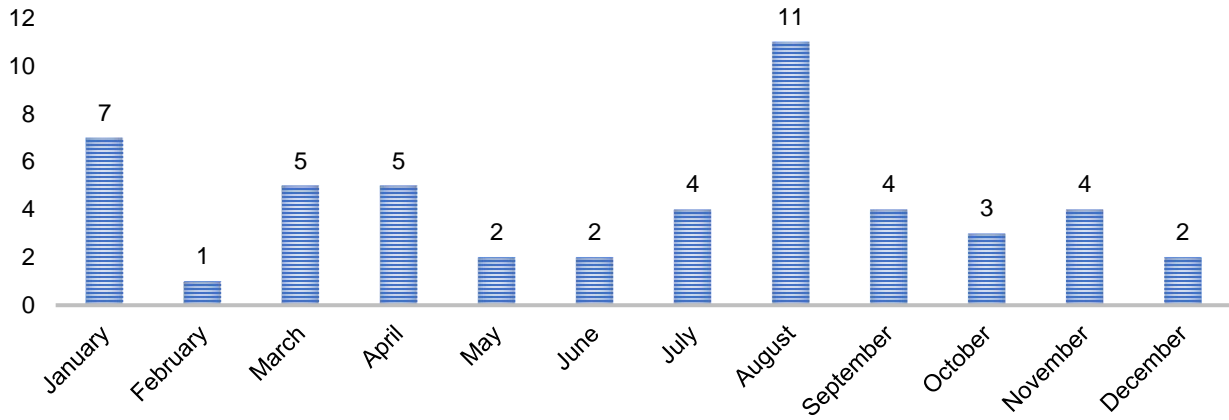


Figure 4. Number of Negligent Manslaughter Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 5. Number of Justifiable Homicide Victims per Month

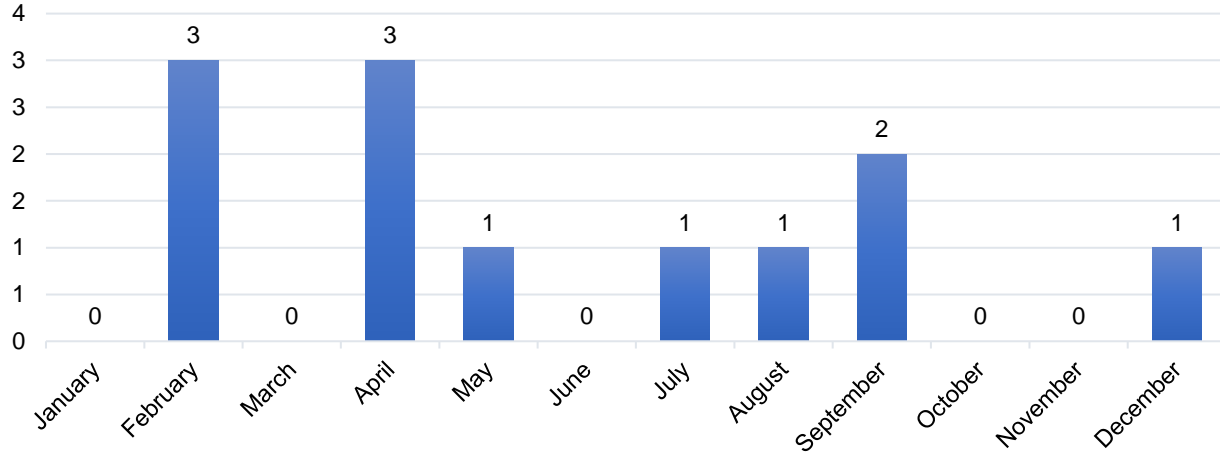


Figure 6. Number of Justifiable Homicide Victims per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 7. Number of Aggravated Assault Crimes per Month

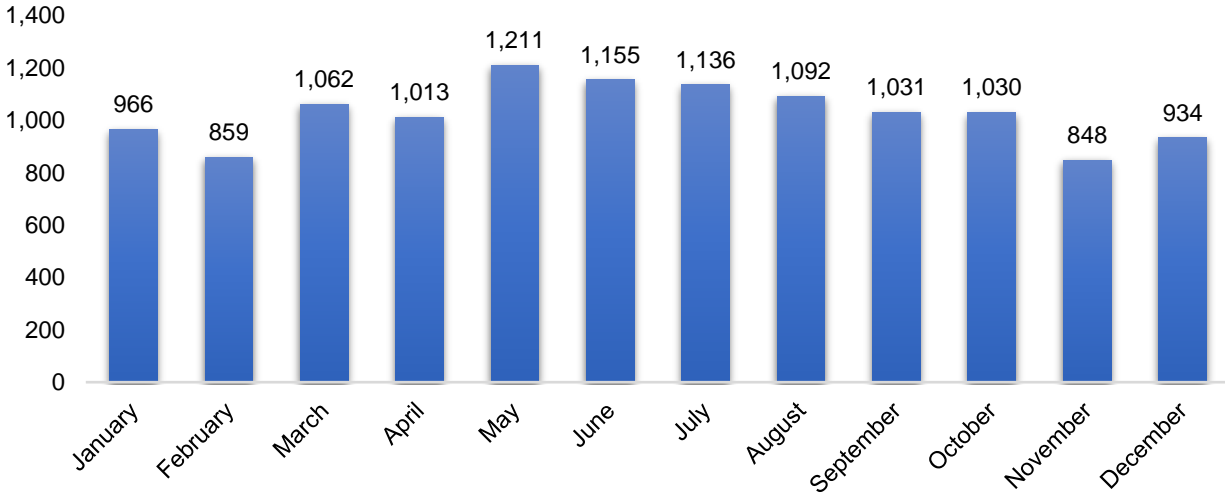


Figure 8. Number of Aggravated Assault Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 9. Number of Simple Assault Crimes per Month

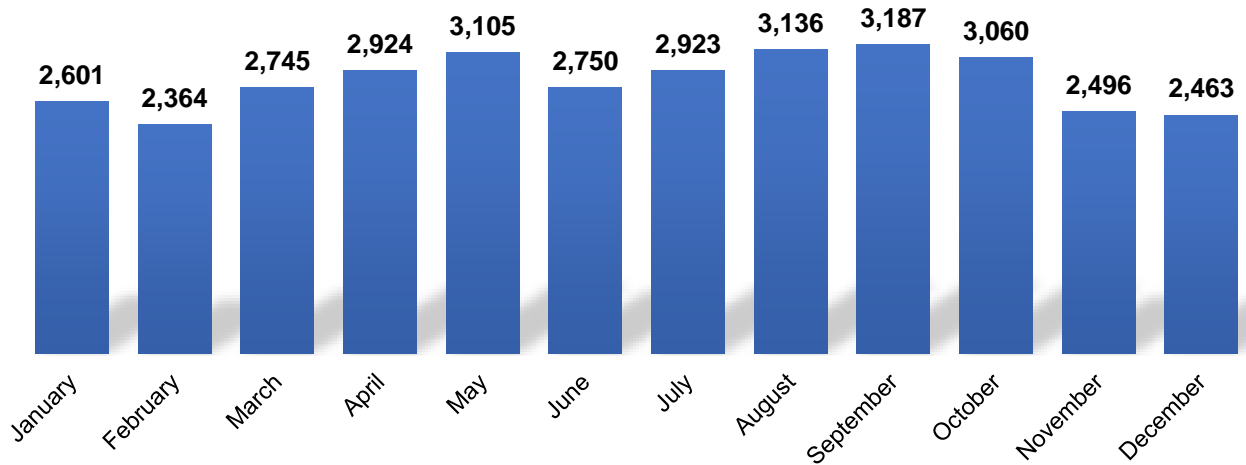


Figure 10. Number of Simple Assault Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 11. Number of Intimidation Crimes per Month

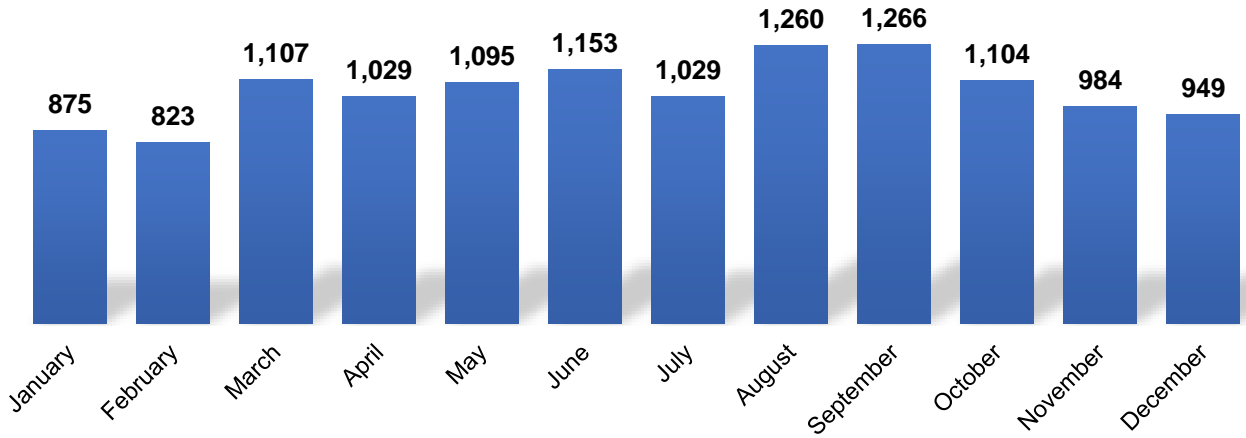


Figure 12. Number of Intimidation Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 13. Number of Forcible Rape Crimes per Month

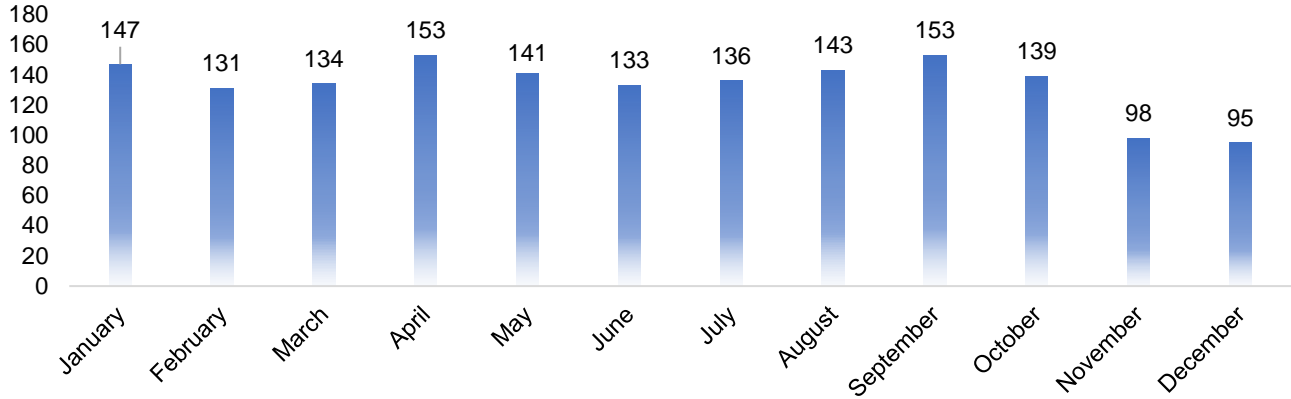


Figure 14. Number of Forcible Rape per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 15. Number of Forcible Sodomy Crimes per Month

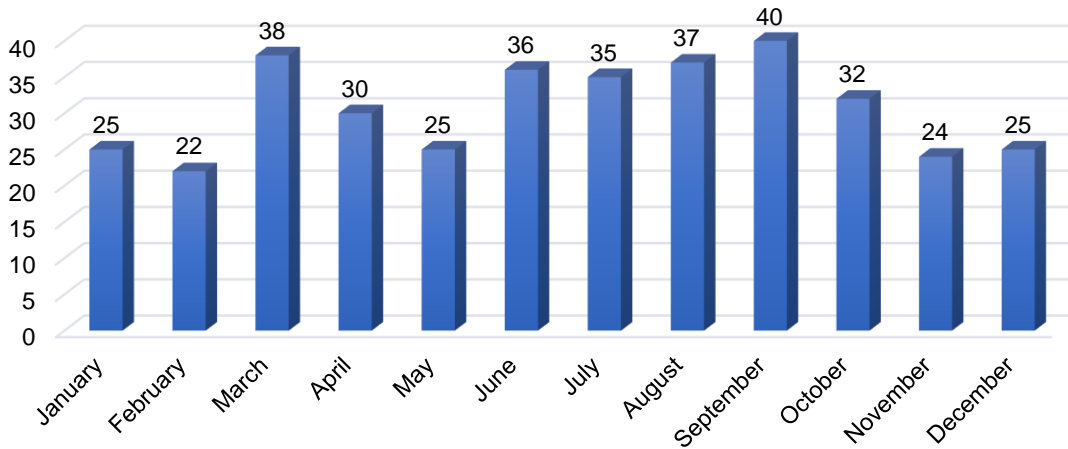


Figure 16. Number of Forcible Sodomy Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 17. Number of Sexual Assault with an Object Crimes per Month

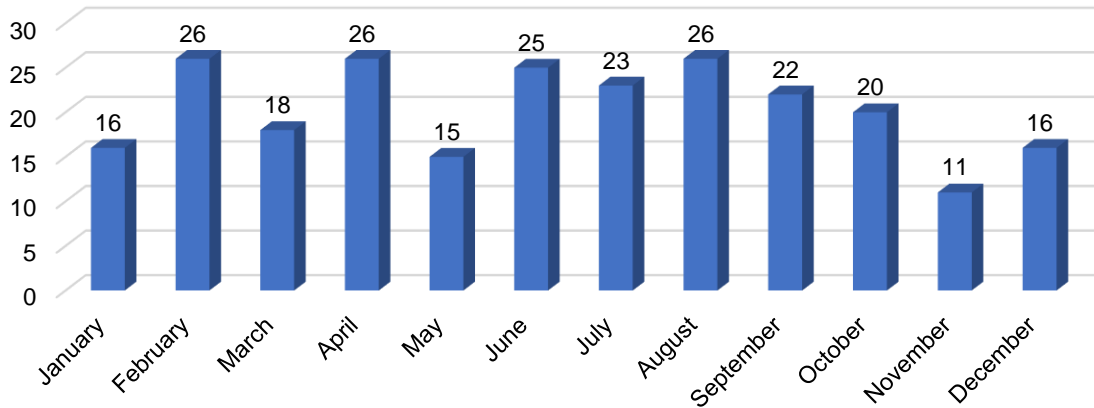


Figure 18. Number of Sexual Assault with an Object Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 19. Number of Forcible Fondling Crimes per Month

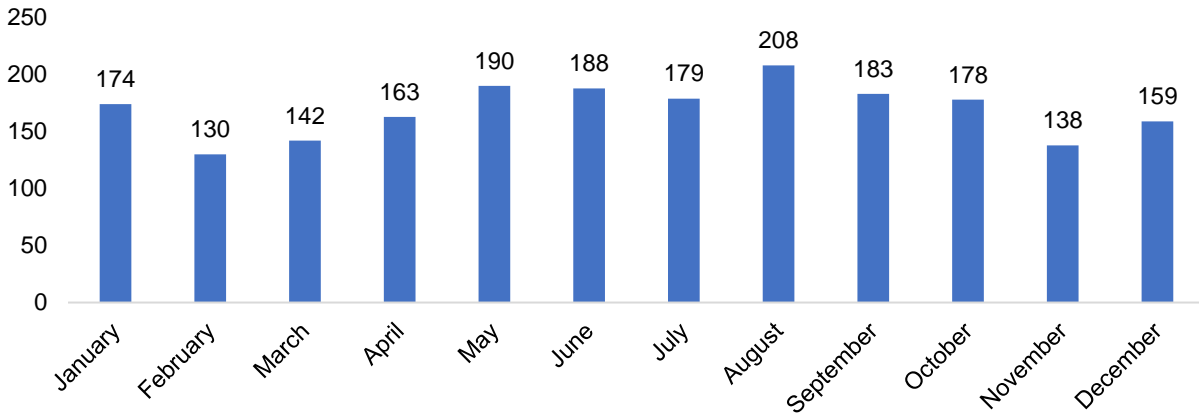


Figure 20. Number of Forcible Fondling Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 21. Number of Incest Crimes per Month

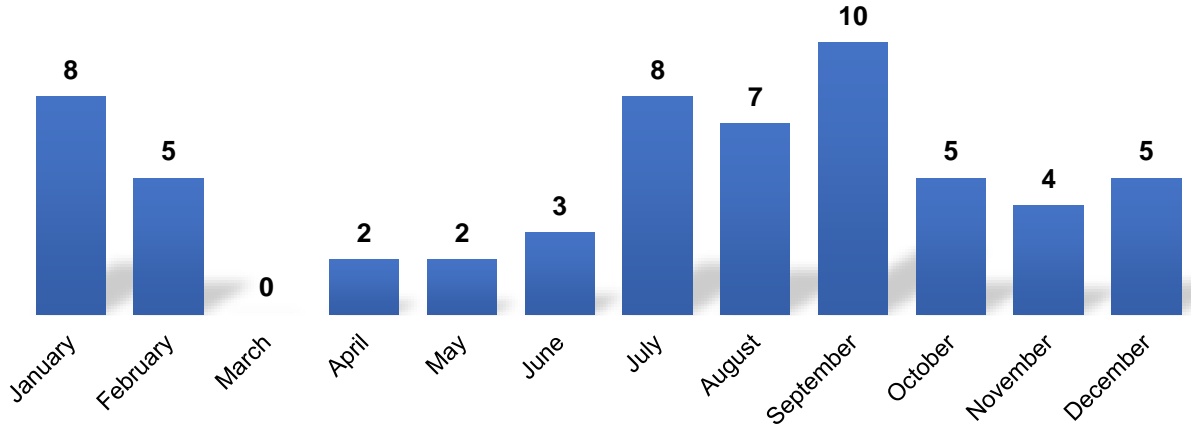


Figure 22. Number of Incest Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 23. Number of Statutory Rape Crimes per Month

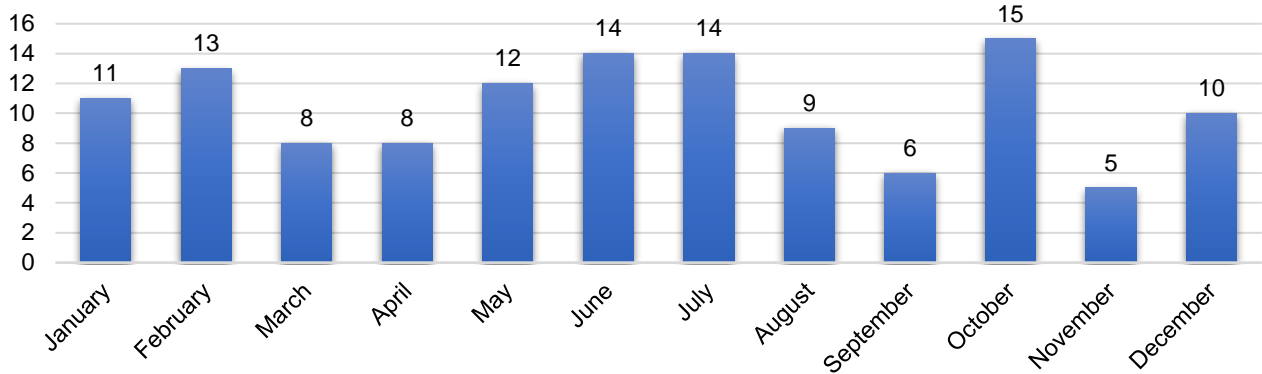


Figure 24. Number of Statutory Rape Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 25. Number of Human Trafficking-Commercial Sex Acts per Month

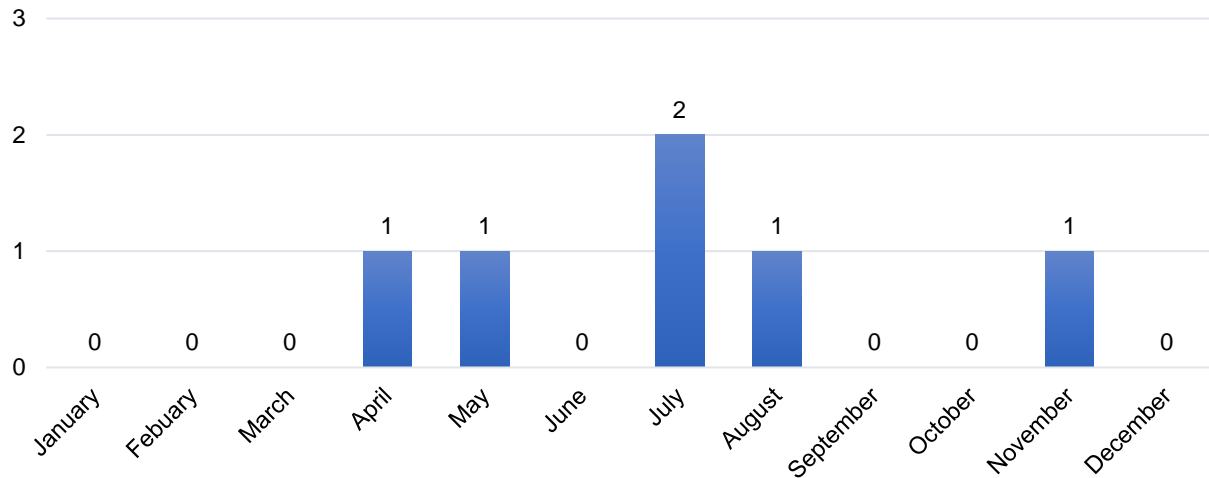


Figure 26. Number of Human Trafficking-Commercial Sex Acts per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 27. Number of Human Trafficking-Involuntary Servitude Crimes per Month

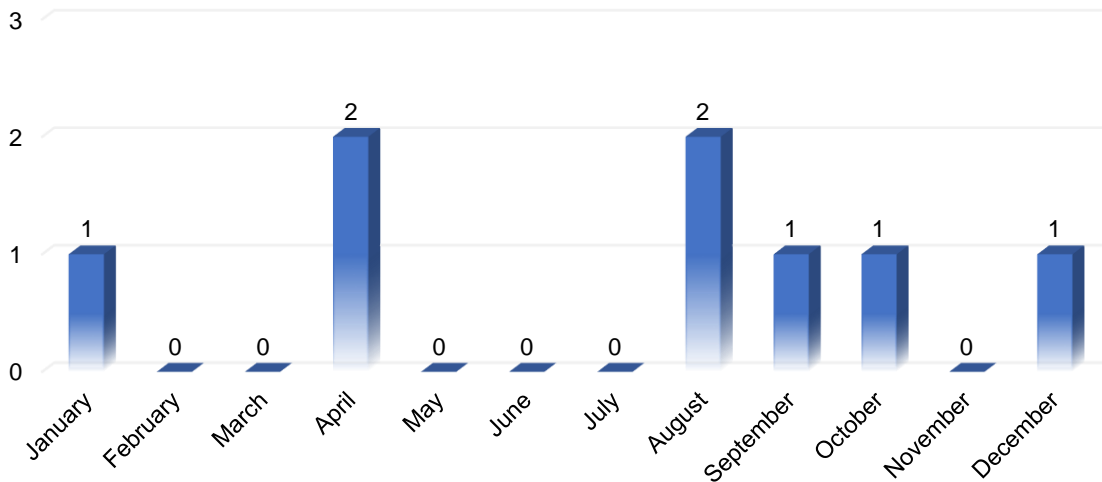


Figure 28. Number of Human Trafficking-Involuntary Servitude Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 29. Number of Kidnapping/Abduction Crimes per Month

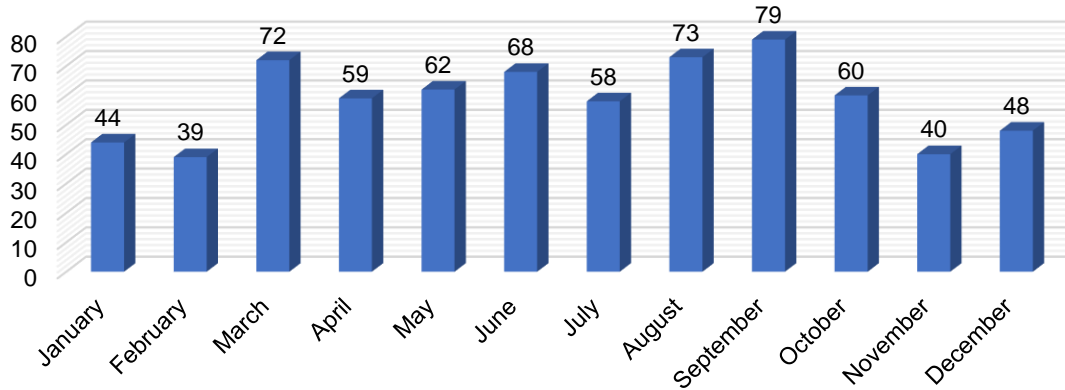


Figure 30. Number of Kidnapping/Abduction Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 31. Number of Robbery Crimes per Month

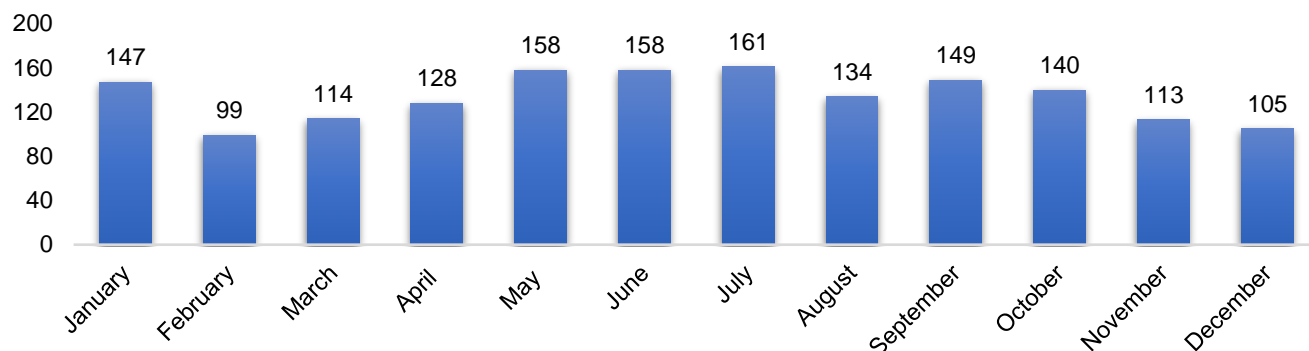


Figure 32. Number of Robbery Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 33. Number of Arson Crimes per Month

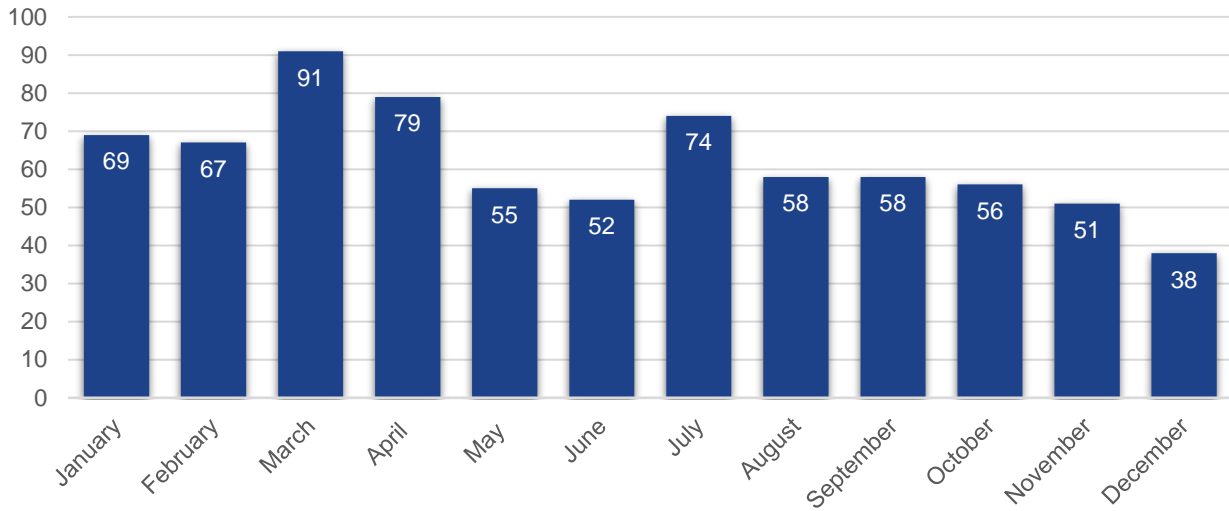


Figure 34. Number of Arson Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 35. Number of Extortion/Blackmail Crimes per Month

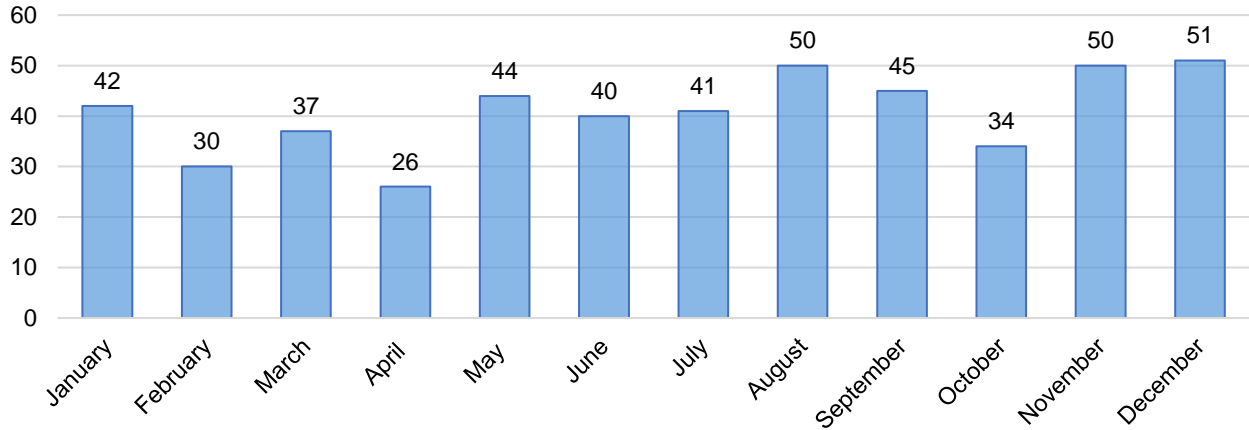


Figure 36. Number of Extortion/Blackmail Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 37. Number of Burglary/Breaking & Entering Crimes per Month

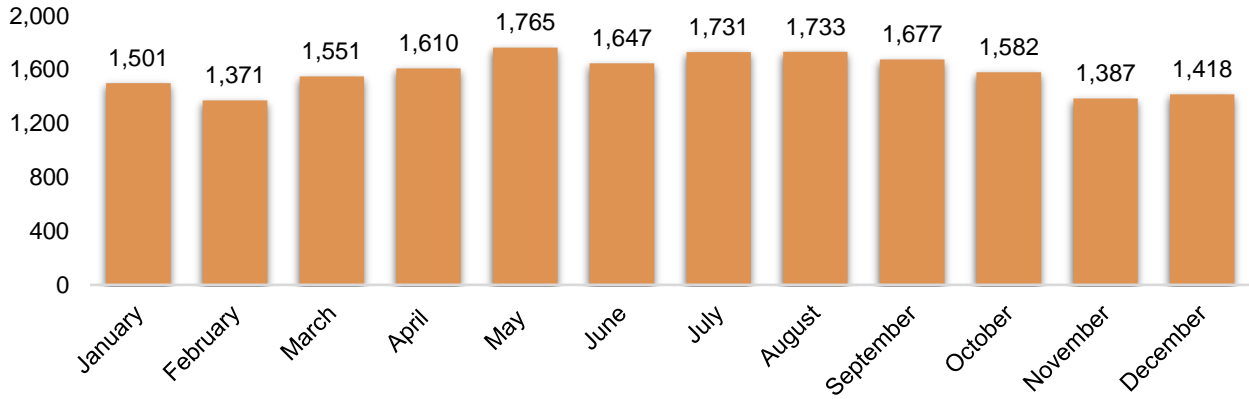


Figure 38. Number of Burglary/Breaking & Entering Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 39. Number of Motor Vehicle Theft Crimes per Month

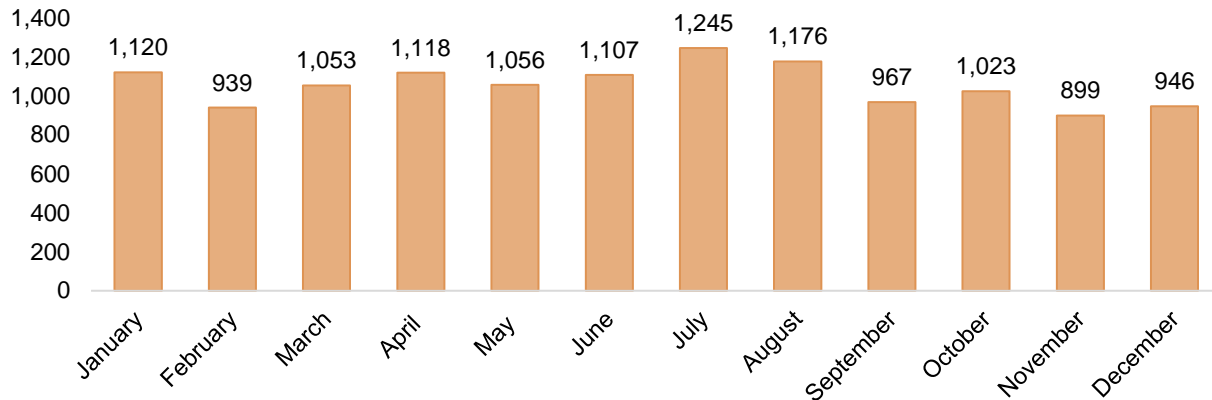


Figure 40. Number of Motor Vehicle Theft Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 41. Number of Counterfeiting/Forgery Crimes per Month

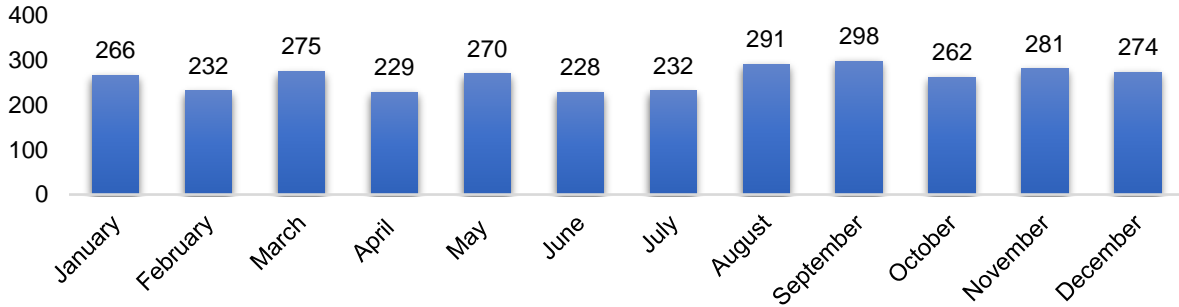


Figure 42. Number of Counterfeiting/Forgery Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 43. Number of Embezzlement Crimes per Month

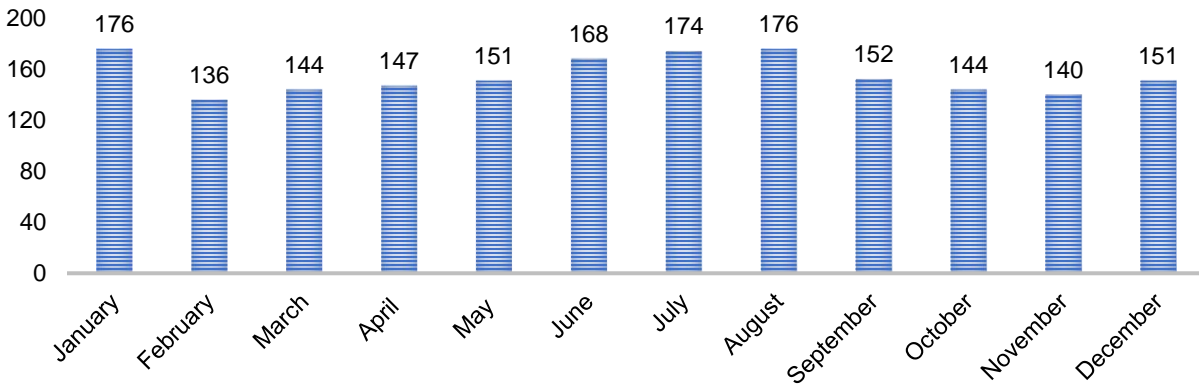


Figure 44. Number of Embezzlement Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 45. Number of Stolen Property Offenses per Month

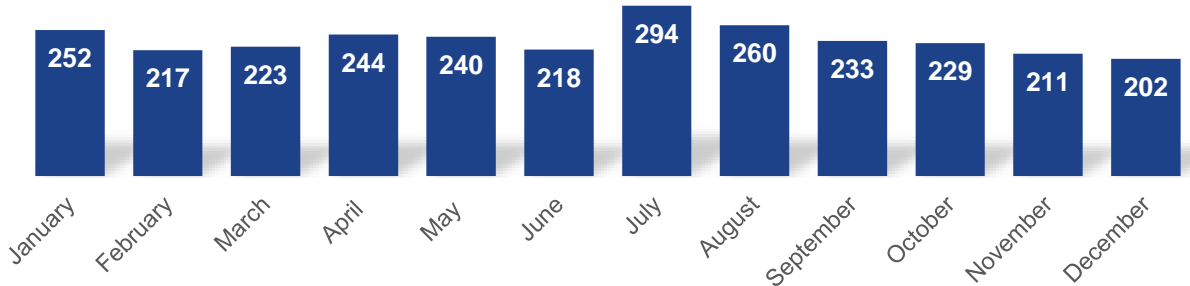


Figure 46. Number of Stolen Property Offenses per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 47. Number of Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property Crimes per Month

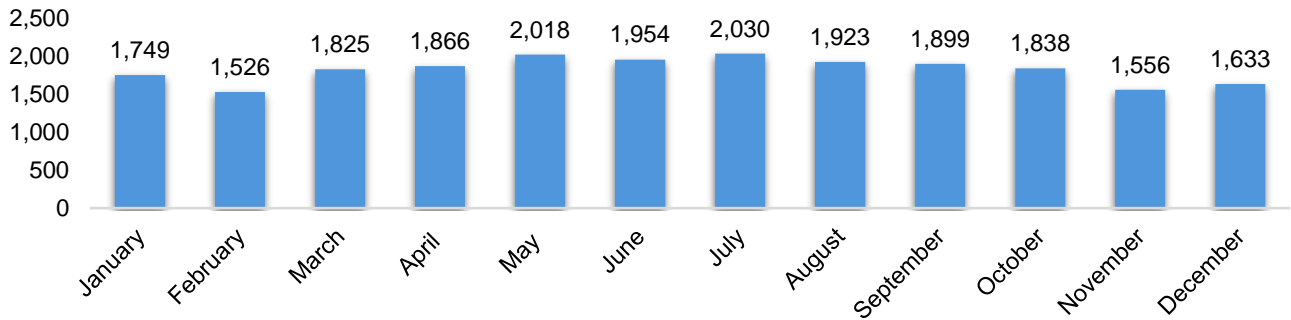


Figure 48. Number of Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 49. Number of Bribery Crimes per Month

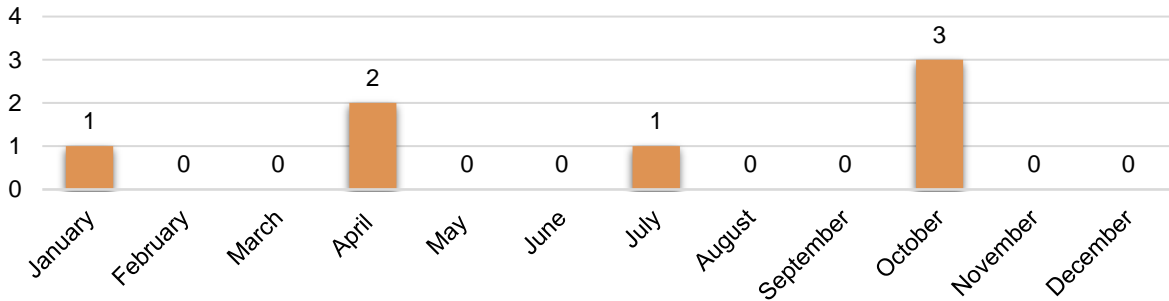


Figure 50. Number of Bribery Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 51. Number of Larceny Crimes per Month

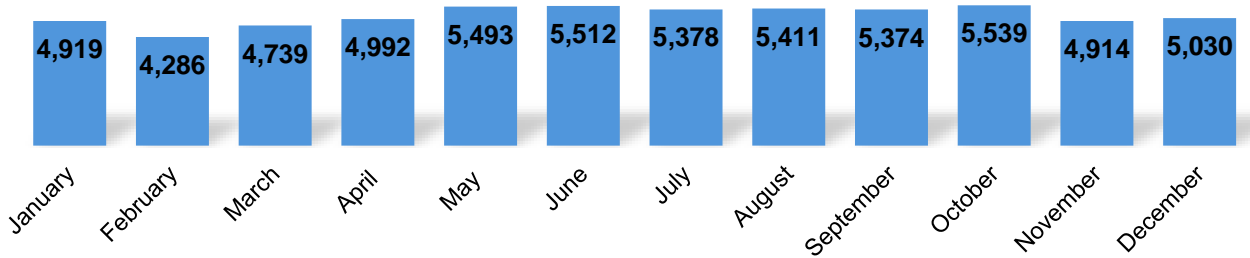


Figure 52. Number of Larceny Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 53. Number of Larceny Crimes by Type

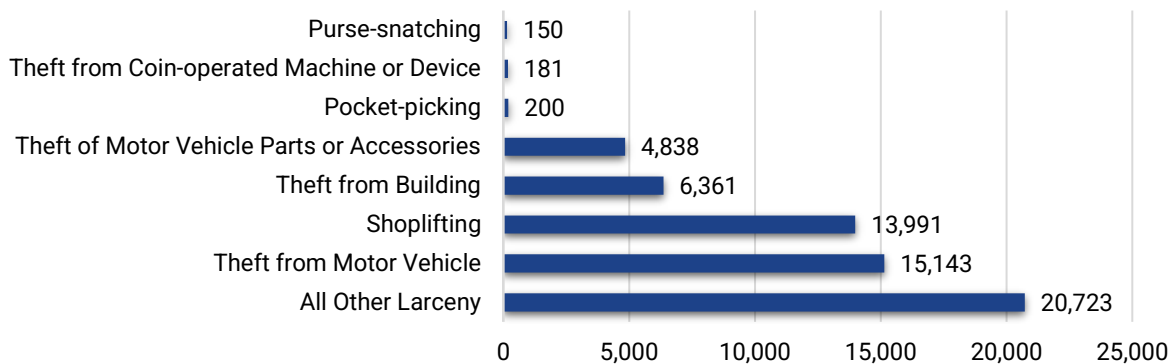

Figure 54. Number of Fraud Crimes per Month

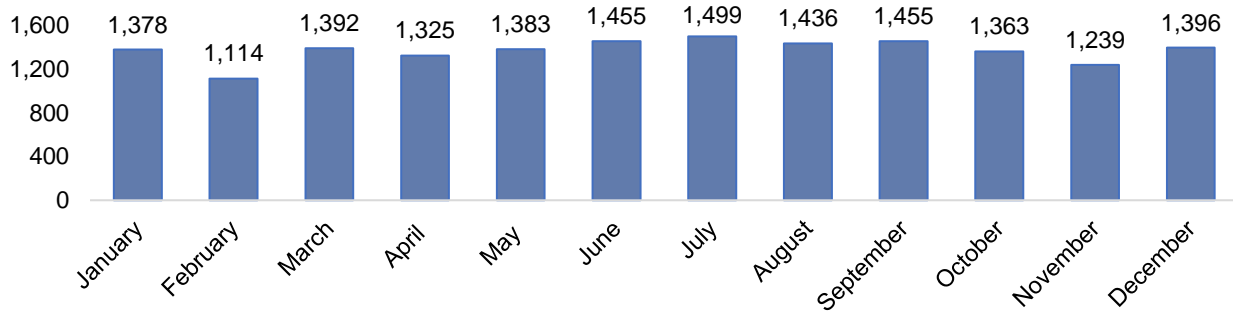


Figure 55. Number of Fraud Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 56. Number of Fraud Crimes by Type

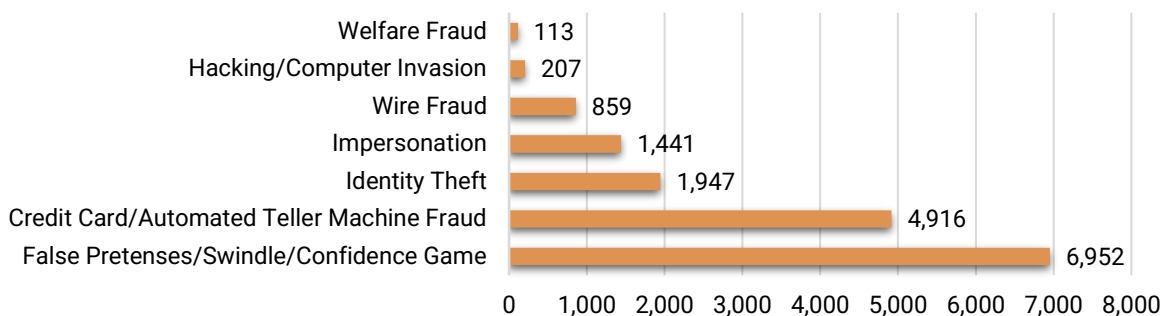

Figure 57. Number of Drug/Narcotic Violations per Month

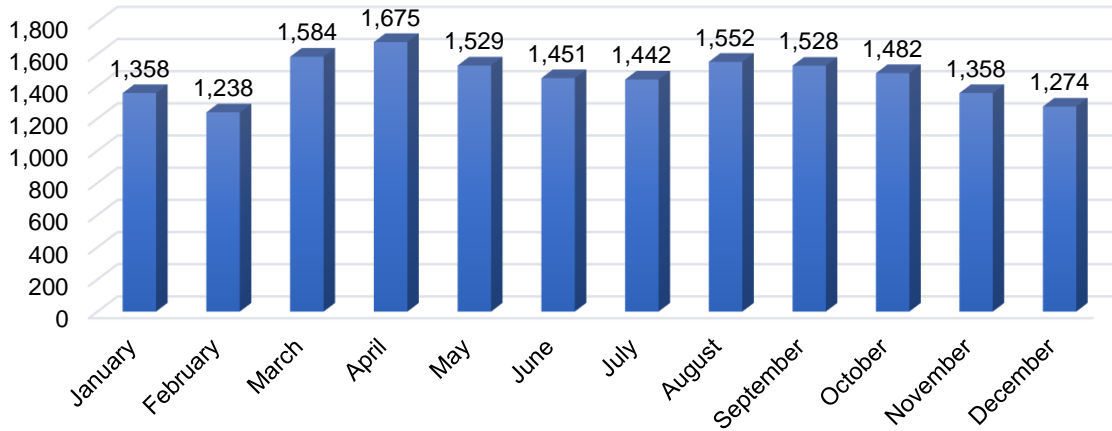


Figure 58. Number of Drug/Narcotic Violations per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 59. Number of Drug Equipment Violations per Month

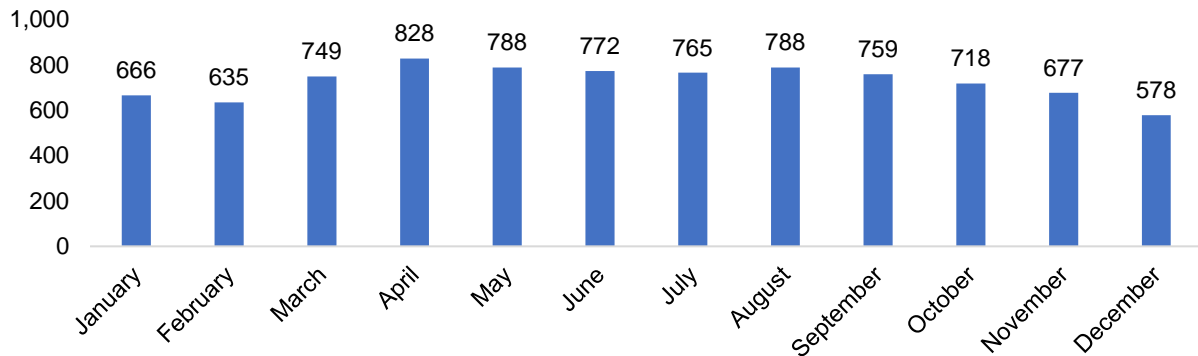


Figure 60. Number of Drug Equipment Violations per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 61. Number of Pornography/Obscene Material Crimes per Month

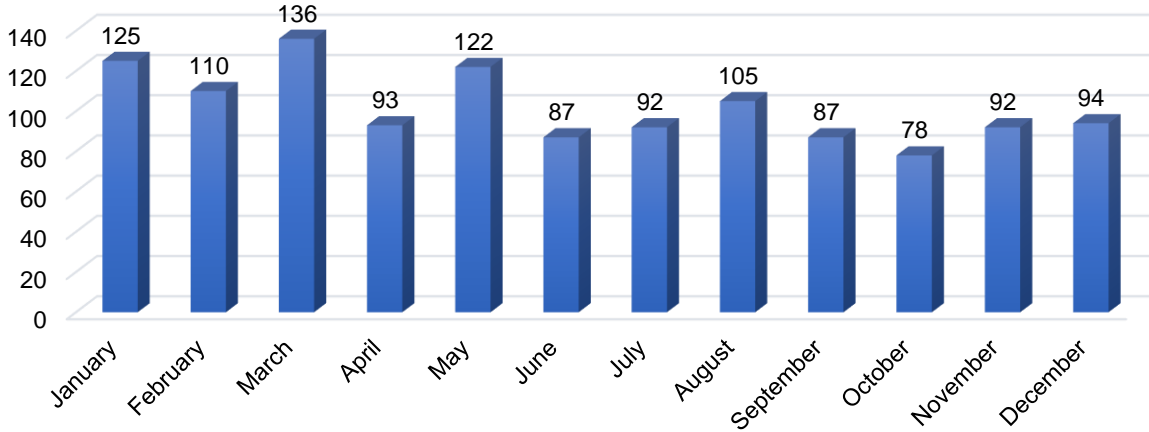


Figure 62. Number of Pornography/Obscene Material Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 63. Number of Prostitution Crimes per Month

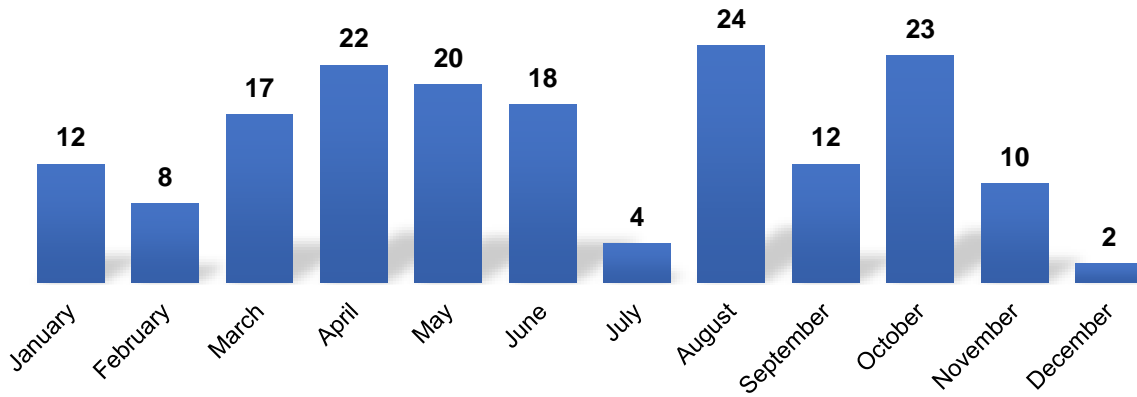


Figure 64. Number of Prostitution Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 65. Number of Assisting or Promoting Prostitution Crimes per Month

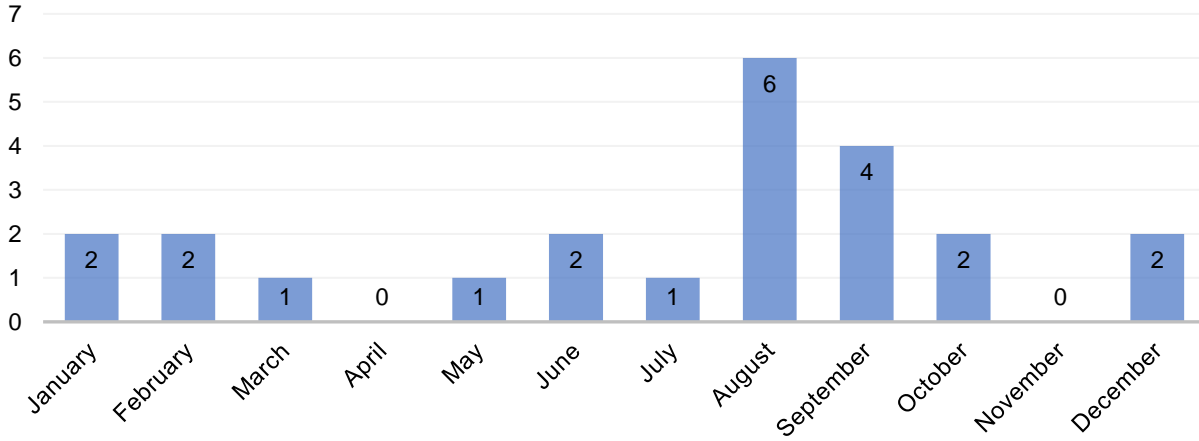


Figure 66. Number of Assisting or Promoting Prostitution Crimes per Day of Week and Time of Day

Figure 67. Number of Purchasing Prostitution Crimes per Month

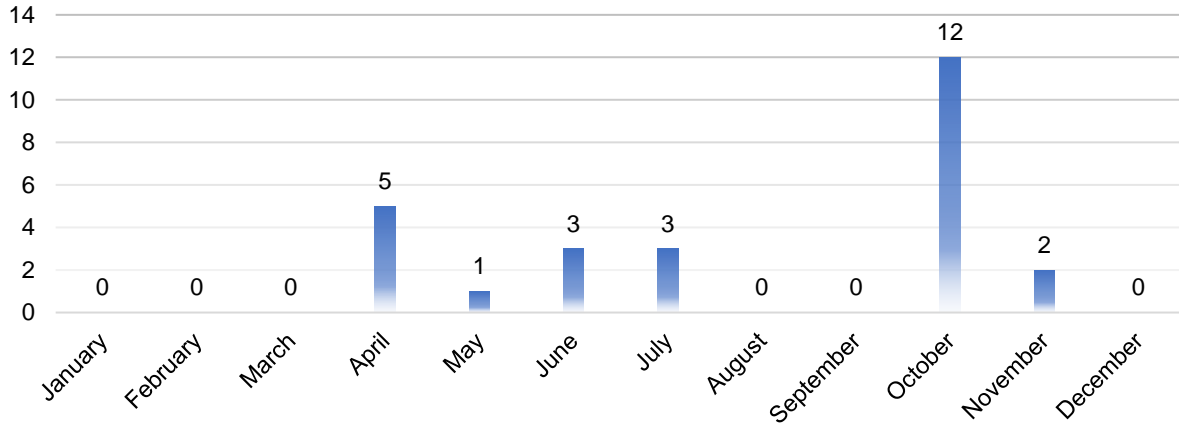


Figure 68. Number of Purchasing Prostitution Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 69. Number of Weapon Law Violations per Month

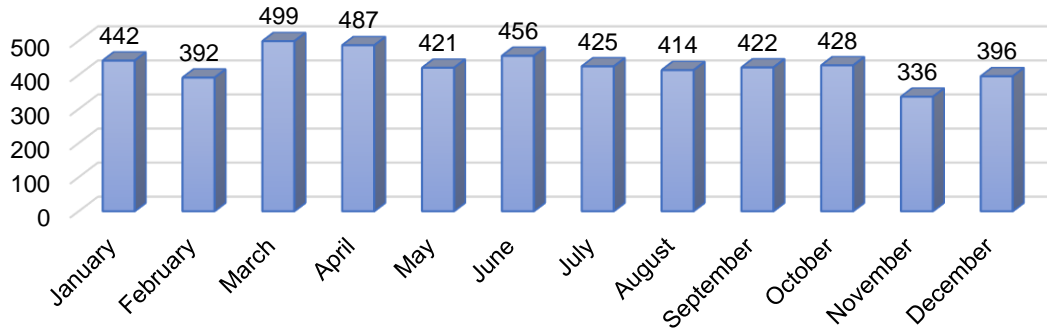


Figure 70. Number of Weapon Law Violations per Day of Week & Time of Day

Figure 71. Number of Animal Cruelty Crimes per Month

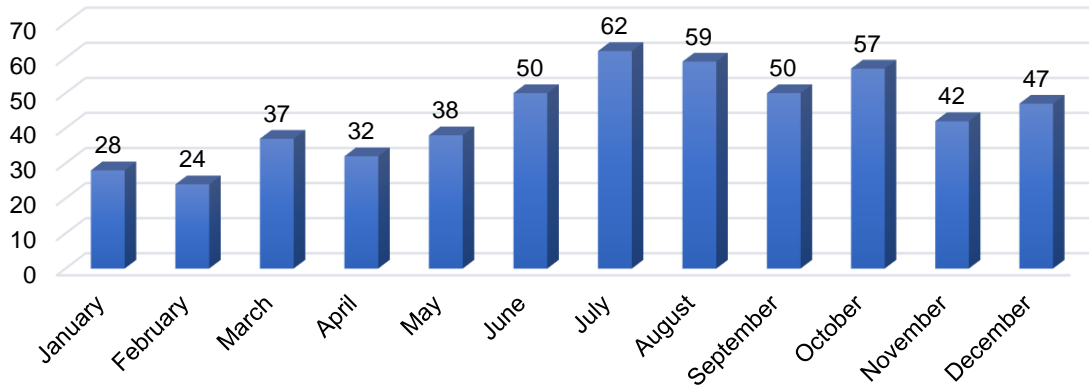


Figure 72. Number of Animal Cruelty Crimes per Day of Week & Time of Day

Law Enforcement Employment

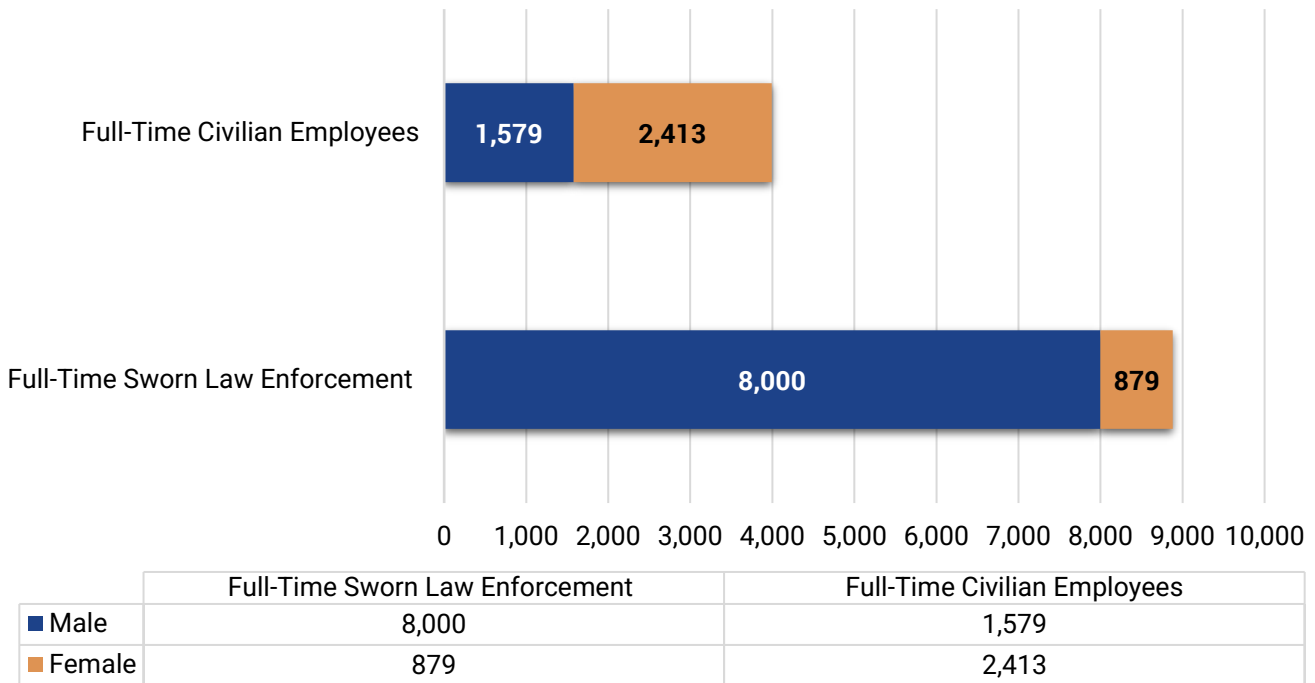
Definition: Persons employed as full-time sworn officers and full-time civilian employees.

Annually, the OSBI sends a survey to all reporting law enforcement agencies throughout the state to determine the number of individuals employed in law enforcement. With the exception of persons who perform guard or protection duties and who are not paid from police funds (i.e., school crossing guards, special officers, and merchant police), these figures reflect the number of full-time sworn personnel with full arrest power, including the chief, sheriff, commissioner, and superintendent.

Civilians include: clerks, radio dispatchers, meter maids, stenographers, mechanics, etc., provided these persons are full-time employees of the agency. Neither employees who are compensated from a source other than police funds, nor those receiving salaries from federal grants are included.

In 2022, Oklahoma’s law enforcement employment rate was 3.2 per 1,000 inhabitants.

Glossary

Group A

Crimes Against Persons

Homicide Offenses (09A-09C)

The killing of one human being by another.

Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter (09A)

The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Negligent Manslaughter (09B)

The killing of another person through negligence.

Justifiable Homicide (09C) – Not a Crime

The killing of a perpetrator of a serious criminal offense by a peace officer in the line of duty, or the killing, during the commission of a serious criminal offense, of the perpetrator by a private individual.

Assault Offenses (13A-13C)

An unlawful attack by one person upon another.

Aggravated Assault (13A)

An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

Simple Assault (13B)

An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

Intimidation (13C)

To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.

Forcible Sex Offenses (11A-11D)

Any sexual act directed against another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent.

Forcible Rape (11A)

The carnal knowledge of a person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Forcible Sodomy (11B)

Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Sexual Assault with an Object (11C)

To use an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Forcible Fondling (11D)

The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Non-Forcible Sex Offenses (36A-36B)

Unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse.

Incest (36A)

Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees where marriage is prohibited by law.

Statutory Rape (36B)

Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

Human Trafficking Offenses (64A-64B)

The inducement of a person to perform a commercial sex act, or labor, or services, through force, fraud, or coercion.

Human Trafficking, Commercial Sex Acts (64A)

Inducing a person by force, fraud, or coercion to participate in commercial sex acts, or in which the person induced to perform such act(s) has not attained 18 years of age.

Human Trafficking, Involuntary Servitude (64B)

The obtaining of a person(s) through recruitment, harboring, transportation, or provision, and subjecting such persons by force, fraud, or coercion into voluntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery (not to include commercial sex acts).

Kidnapping/Abduction (100)

The unlawful seizure, transportation, and/or detention of a person against his/her will or of a minor without the consent of his/her custodial parent(s) or legal guardian.

Crimes Against Property

Robbery (120)

The taking or attempting to take anything of value under confrontational circumstances from the control, custody, or care of another person by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

Arson (200)

To unlawfully and intentionally damage or attempt to damage any real or personal property by fire or incendiary device.

Extortion/Blackmail (210)

To unlawfully obtain money, property, or any other thing of value, either tangible or intangible, through the use or threat of force, misuse of authority, threat of criminal prosecution, threat of destruction of reputation or social standing, or through other coercive means.

Burglary/Breaking and Entering (220)

The unlawful entry into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a felony or a theft.

Motor Vehicle Theft (240)

The theft of a motor vehicle.

Counterfeiting/Forgery (250)

The altering, copying, or imitation of something, without authority or right, with the intent to deceive or defraud by passing the copy or thing altered or imitated as that which is original or genuine; or, the selling, buying, or possession of an altered, copied, or imitated thing with the intent to deceive or defraud.

Embezzlement (270)

The unlawful misappropriation by an offender to his/her own use or purpose of money, property, or some other thing of value entrusted to his/her care, custody, or control.

Stolen Property Offenses (280)

Receiving, buying, selling, possessing, concealing, or transporting any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by Burglary, Embezzlement, Fraud, Larceny, Robbery, etc.

Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property (290)

To willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface, or otherwise injure real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.

Bribery (510)

The offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value (e.g., a bribe, gratuity, or kickback) to sway the judgement or action of a person in a position of trust or influence.

Fraud Offenses (26A-26G)

The intentional perversion of the truth for the purpose of inducing another person or other entity in reliance upon it to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right.

False Pretenses/ Swindle/Confidence Game (26A)

The intentional misrepresentation of existing fact or condition or the use of some other deceptive scheme or device to obtain money, goods, or other things of value.

Credit Card/Automated Teller Machine Fraud (26B)

The unlawful use of a credit (or debit) card or automatic teller machine for fraudulent purposes.

Impersonation (26C)

Falsely representing one's identity or position and acting in the character or position thus unlawfully assumed to deceive others and thereby gain a profit or advantage, enjoy some right or privilege, or subject another person or entity to an expense, charge, or liability that would not have otherwise been incurred.

Welfare Fraud (26D)

The use of deceitful statements, practices, or devices to unlawfully obtain welfare benefits.

Wire Fraud (26E)

The use of an electric or electronic communications facility to intentionally transmit a false and/or deceptive message in furtherance of a fraudulent activity.

Identity Theft (26F)

Wrongfully obtaining and using another person's personal data (e.g., name, date of birth, Social Security number, driver's license number, credit card number).

Hacking/Computer Invasion (26G)

Wrongfully gaining access to another person's or institution's computer software, hardware, or networks without authorized permissions or security clearances.

Larceny Offenses (23A-23H)

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another person.

Pocket-Picking (23A)

The theft of articles from another person's physical possession by stealth where the victim usually does not become immediately aware of the theft.

Purse-Snatching (23B)

The grabbing or snatching of a purse, handbag, etc. from the physical possession of another person.

Shoplifting (23C)

The theft by someone other than an employee of the victim of goods or merchandise exposed for sale.

Theft from Building (23D)

A theft from within a building which is either open to the general public or to which the offender has legal access.

Theft from Coin-Operated Machine or Device (23E)

A theft from a machine or device that is operated or activated by the use of coins.

Theft from Motor Vehicle (23F)

The theft of articles from a motor vehicle, locked or unlocked.

Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories (23G)

The theft of any part or accessory affixed to the interior or exterior of a motor vehicle in a manner which would make the item an attachment of the vehicle or necessary for its legal operation.

All Other Larceny (23H)

All thefts that do not fit any of the definitions of the specific subcategories of Larceny /Theft listed above.

Crimes Against Society**Drug/Narcotic Offenses (35A-35B)**

The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.

Drug/Narcotic Violations (35A)

The unlawful cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, purchase, use, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug or narcotic substance.

Drug Equipment Violations (35B)

The unlawful manufacture, sale, purchase, possession, or transportation of equipment or devices utilized in preparing and/or using drugs or narcotics.

Gambling Offenses (39A-39D)

To unlawfully bet or wager money or something else of value; assist, promote, or operate a game of chance for money or some other stake; possess or transmit wagering information; manufacture, sell, purchase, possess, or transport gambling equipment, devices, or goods; or tamper with the outcome of a sporting event or contest to gain a gambling advantage.

Betting/Wagering (39A)

To unlawfully stake money or something else of value on the happening of an uncertain event or on the ascertainment of a fact in dispute.

Operating/Promoting/Assisting Gambling (39B)

To unlawfully operate, promote, or assist in the operation of a game of chance, lottery, or other gambling activity.

Gambling Equipment Violations (39C)

To unlawfully manufacture, sell, buy, possess, or transport equipment, devices, and/or goods used for gambling purposes.

Sports Tampering (39D)

To unlawfully alter, meddle in, or otherwise interfere with a sporting contest or event for the purpose of gaining a gambling advantage.

Pornography/Obscene Material (370)

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, publishing (publication), distributing (distribution), sale, purchase, or possession of sexually explicit material deemed legally obscene.

Prostitution Offenses (40A–40C)

To unlawfully engage in or promote sexual activities for anything of value.

Prostitution (40A)

To engage in commercial sex acts for anything of value.

Assisting or Promoting Prostitution (40B)

To solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution.

Purchasing Prostitution (40C)

To purchase or trade anything of value for commercial sex acts.

Weapon Law Violations (520)

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons.

Animal Cruelty (720)

Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly taking an action that mistreats or kills any animal without just cause, such as torturing, tormenting, mutilation, maiming, poisoning, or abandonment.

Group B:

Bad Checks (90A) (except Counterfeit Checks or Forged Checks)

Knowingly and intentionally writing and/or negotiating checks drawn against insufficient or nonexistent funds.

Curfew/Loitering/Vagrancy Violations (90B)

The violation of a court order, regulation, ordinance, or law requiring the withdrawal of persons from the streets or other specified areas; prohibiting persons from remaining in an area or place in an idle or aimless manner; or prohibiting persons from going from place to place without a visible means of support.

Disorderly Conduct (90C)

Any behavior that tends to disturb the public peace or decorum, scandalize the community, or shock the public sense of morality.

Driving Under the Influence (90D)

Driving or operating a motor vehicle or common carrier while mentally or physically impaired as the result of consuming an alcoholic beverage or using a drug or narcotic.

Drunkenness (90E)

To drink alcoholic beverages to the extent that one's mental faculties and physical coordination are substantially impaired

Family Offenses, Non-Violent (90F)

Unlawful, non-violent acts by a family member (or legal guardian) that threaten the physical, mental, or economic well-being or morals of another family member and that are not classifiable as other offenses such as assault, incest, and statutory rape.

Liquor Law Violations (90G) (except Driving Under the Influence)

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages.

Peeping Tom (90H)

To secretly look through a window, doorway, keyhole, or other aperture for the purpose of voyeurism.

Runaway (90I) (Not A Crime)

A person under 18 years of age who has left home without the permission of his/her parent(s) or legal guardian.

Trespass of Real Property (90J)

To unlawfully enter land, a dwelling, or other real property.

All Other Offenses (90Z)

All crimes that are not Group A offenses and not included in one of the specifically named Group B crime categories listed previously.
