SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students. Approval is recommended.

Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.

B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:

1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with at-risk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
8. Offer individualized instruction;
9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
12. Offer life skills instruction;
13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.

C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.

D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:

1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;

2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.

F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.

G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.

2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
 - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
 - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
 - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
 - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
 - e. providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.
3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.

H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.

I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.

K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.

L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.

M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section.

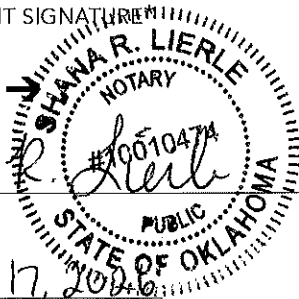

Lookeba- Sickles has been in a Co-op for several years. This year the Co-op just informed us they were not having a program. We have not had students need this program in years. We would like to act as a stand alone program.

We plan to offer a class of credit recovery for those needing additional hours. We also will be using a PBIS system that helps motivate our students. We will also be tracking attendance through a truancy officer and working with the district attorney's office. We are a rural district. We plan to use that as an advantage and build really strong relationships with these students so that they feel safe and want to attend school.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Yes we have previously Co-op with Ft. Cobb and most recently Hinton Public Schools. I do not believe we have been awarded this waiver before.

Credit recovery hours will be offered 1st- 3rd hours & 6th- 7th hours.

We would use the funds to help with a credit recovery software and a possible stipend for one of our educators to teach the class if needed.

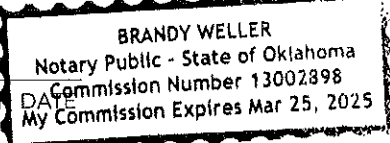

A:

For the past many years at Tupelo school we have been in a coop with Coalgate school for Alt. Ed. We must find someone to drive our students to Coalgate where they get on a bus and travel another 15 miles to Atoka to the Alt. Ed. building. It is very inconvenient to try and get someone to drive them to Coalgate and to go back and pick them up every day. Having our own Alt. School that we can use for Alt. Ed., Credit Recovery, ISD, and Concurrent enrollment students would enhance our programs and benefit our student population tremendously. The percentage of our student population that having our own on-site Alt. School would benefit would be at least an 8 to 10 percent increase from the coop we were in with Coalgate. If this wavier is denied I have no idea where we would go from here, it would be disastrous for our school.

B:

This is Tupelo Schools second ever request for a waiver to have our own Alt. School on our school site. We only have two full time Alt. Ed. students but use our new Alt. Ed. building for credit recovery for student attending career tech that miss required courses or have failed past required courses because of the pandemic Covid-19 or other reasons. Also, we use the building for ISD which has cut down on behavior issues and logistics of having a in school detention room instead of sending kids home on suspension. Furthermore, we use the Alt. School for our students to go who are taking college courses (Concurrent Enrollment) and not enrolled in certain courses at our school. We never have more than 10 students served in the Alt. Ed. building at one time. Having our own Alt. Ed. school has enabled me to use what had been my Math teacher teaching out of her area on an Alt. Certificate for the past two years as my Alt. Ed. certified teacher. This has enabled the district to employ a certified Math teacher for junior high and high school which was very much needed. I also have a full-time teachers Aide with the certified Alt. Ed. teacher.

C:

Tupelo School has been in the Coop with Coalgate school for many years. As I said it has only benefited our full time Alt. Ed students and has been very inconvenient as far as transportation and logistics. This will be our second Wavier request, as this is our first opportunity to have our own Alt. School on site. Therefore, we are early in this process and cannot yet measure the educational impact on our district. However, we cannot see how this will not benefit our school, students, and staff by having our own Alt. Ed. school, program on our campus to monitor ourselves. Being able to use our Alt. Ed. school for credit recovery, ISD, concurrent enrollment is just what the doctor ordered for our small rural district of 228 total student population K-12.

D:

Tupelo Schools timeline is having our Alt. School the same number of days and times as our regular schedule. 8:00 am to 3:05 pm 5 days a week unless we are scheduled to be out school wide. We will use a parent/student interview process for students to be enrolled in our full time Alt. Ed. program and we will use the Acellus assessment program to determine student success. We have purchased the Acellus online program for our Alt. Ed. curriculum and credit recovery program. We will attend in person 166 days for the 2022-23 school year and a grand total of 1140.25 hours of school for the year. We will ensure that all Alt. Ed. students have the opportunity to attend extracurricular events. Furthermore, that all ISD and Alt. Ed. students receive at least one hour social and emotional counseling from our school counselor each week. Finally, all Alt. Ed. students and ISD students will be assigned purpose prep lessons which is part of the Acellus online program that gives the students lessons in motivation, anger management, self-control, vaping, and many other social and emotional issues.

E:

The financial impact to the Tupelo school is both positive and negative. We will no longer be out transportation cost to Coalgate schools driving our student to Alt. Ed. every day and paying someone to drive them. We will also not be paying Coalgate school the fee they charge above the money we had to transfer to them that the State Department of Education allocated to us. They charged \$25 per student per day after the first student plus meal cost. The cost for Tupelo school to operate it's own Alt. Ed., credit recovery, ISD, concurrent enrollment building is as substantial this second year. We purchased a property across the street from our campus (walking distance) and turned it into our Alt. Ed. academy. (We call it the Tupelo Tiger Alt. Ed. Academy) The students are very proud of this new addition and have taken pride in us having our own on campus Alt. Ed. school with other positive additions. We completely renovated the property with new paint, carpet, built computer and ISD stations, new bathrooms, new lighting, new HAVC, security cameras. Cost: Property, \$150,000.00, Computers and online Programs and assessments \$23,000.00, renovations, \$9,000.00, Teacher, \$38,000.00, Aide, \$18,000.00. We do realize this is a substantial startup cost, however we feel that the positive impact it will have on our at risk students will be well worth the investment in the long run.

F:

We will measure our success or lack of success by the number of students we are now able to serve in the many different areas that our Alt. Ed. school building will be used. How many more students now take credit recovery classes, than in years past, as well as adding more full time Alt. Ed. students whom did not want to travel to Coalgate and Atoka to go to Alt. Ed. in the past. We will use our Acellus assessment online program to determine if students are on task and progressing through the program. Success will be measured by the number of students graduating from Tupelo school through our Alt. Ed. program whom otherwise would have been a drop out.

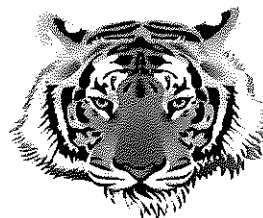

Our current LEA will no longer be providing the service for our school. There are no schools in our county providing Alt Ed COOP services as an LEA. We are not aware of an LEA offering COOP services within 60 miles. If the waiver is denied, students would be traveling at least an hour to and from a provider. We do not project any Alternative Ed. students for the 2023-24 school year. If approved, 100% of any future Alternative Ed. students would benefit.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

The district will have tutoring available for students up to one hour each day after school. We also will have bi-lingual tutors for students that need help in language development. We have a student counsel to aid in advisory for these potential students. We will utilize the Alpha Plus program, as well as many other programs to determine the students' status in learning objectives. Counseling will be available as needed. We have a food pantry and we are a part of the Food For Kids Program. Each student will have their own computer provided by the district and internet access, if needed. This would be the first year for the waiver. Learning achievement will be monitored through periodic assessment and eventually end-of-year exams such as ACT or state exams, classroom grades, semester tests, and consults with instructors.

- C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

Fargo-Gage Public School has participated in an Alternative Education COOP for many years with Arnett Public School being the LEA. We have not requested or received this waiver previously, therefore there are no results of the statutory waiver to report.



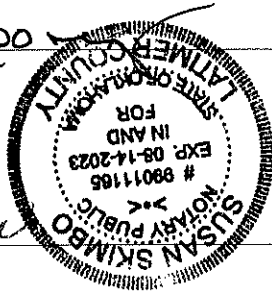

The Alternative School for Wilburton has been very beneficial for our students. Wilburton is requesting a one-year waiver to continue offering the alternative school option for our students. A cooperative program would require more than one hour daily for transportation and would not be in the students best interest. If the waiver is not approved it is likely these students will continue to struggle in the regular education setting or drop out. We estimate that 5% of our students could utilize the alternative school at some point in the school year.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The students enrolled in the alternative education program will have the opportunity to come to school on a modified schedule. Students may arrive on or after 8:00 a.m. to complete their coursework. The learning platform will provide unlimited flexibility for our students to complete lessons outside of school hours. Students will be enrolled in core and elective classes to complete graduation requirements. Participation in extra-curricular activities will be allowed to maintain student involvement in a total school experience. Counseling will be provided to students to streamline enrollment in proper coursework for graduation purposes.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

The past results of the alternative education program for Wilburton has shown to be a beneficial addition to our school. The program aids students in remaining on track for graduation. By offering an alternative school setting our students may continue grade level studies to achieve graduation in a timely and secure manner. The impact on other sites could be beneficial in assisting at-risk students. The presence of an alternative option that is local could keep them from dropping out of school at an early age.

By establishing a local alternative education program we have created a financial strain on our school to benefit students in need. Though our program has proven to be beneficial we do only serve a small percentage while employing certified teachers. We feel we have improved our service, our response to SDE concerns and have corrected past errors in reporting which left the program unfunded by the past two years.

Our alternative education teacher will be evaluated using the TLE framework, rubrics and forms. These factors will assist in creating a positive image for our school program within the community.

Who is eligible for this program?

Students between the ages of 14 and 21 may apply to Wilburton Alternative School if they meet one or more of the following requirements:

- One or more years behind grade level
- Students who have dropped out of school
- Students who are married
- Students who are pregnant or parenting

Suspended or expelled students are not eligible during the term of the suspension or expulsion. Students who qualify for special education services are not usually eligible under special education mandates. Transfer students will not be accepted.

The two admission dates for Wilburton Alternative Academy are August and January. The only exceptions to this rule are those students that are referred by Wilburton High School and are still in compliance with Oklahoma Attendance laws for the current semester.

Students must fill out an application, go through an interview and then may be accepted to the program. **If the student is currently enrolled in a school, they should NOT withdraw from school until they have been accepted to Wilburton Alternative School.** Acceptance and enrollment at Wilburton Alternative School is based on the above criteria, the interview, and on availability of space. There is often a waiting period (after returning the application) before an interview is scheduled. There is no guarantee a student will be accepted to the program.

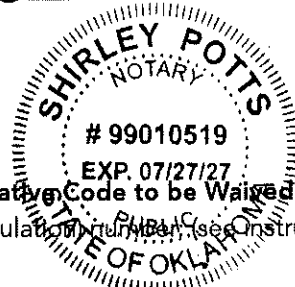

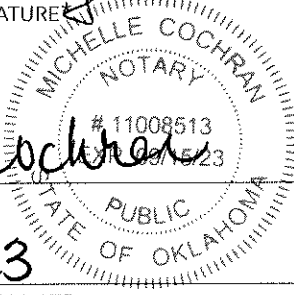

The educational benefits to be derived from allowing Reydon Public School to implement its own Alternative Education Program will be as follows: 1) Ensure that it provides the 17 research based components according to 70 os 1210-568. 2) The travel burden that we have changed by offering our own Alternative Education Program has been very successful the last three years. Students who stay at Reydon to do alternative education classes will also be able to fully participate in the electives needed to graduate. 4) With our rural setting our teachers will be here to help ensure student success and provide assistance with any areas in which they are struggling. 5) Our new online program will also allow the choice of 30 new elective areas to those students that they would otherwise miss on the opportunity. In addition to an online program teachers will be required to provide supplemental instruction and materials.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.

Reydon Public School will offer Alternative Education in house instead of placing a travel burden on students thus increasing education time. Our teachers who know the students will be able to oversee student progress thus increasing student success. Our student success with the cooperative has been disappointing. I feel as though travel is the number one reason for this disappointing level of success. Educating our own students has decreased our number of students being home schooled, transferring to virtual schools, or failing to complete graduation requirements. We are able to closely monitor attendance as well students meeting the class time requirements.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Student performance levels to be demonstrated will be consistent of what are expected from all students at Reydon Public School. Our school has scored an A on every report card the last three years and is a Blue Ribbon School and we are continually looking for ways to improve. Our teachers are required to log three grades per week per student in each class. Progress reports will be presented to students and parents on a weekly basis. Our alternative education plan will require constant monitoring of progress. Pre-testing as well as post-testing will help give us data to make improvements in different areas. Testing each standard as the student moves throughout the curriculum will monitor progression towards mastery.

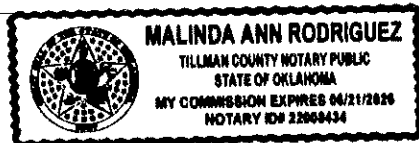

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. We are a rural school in Northwest Oklahoma that may never have more than 10 students enrolled in our alternative education program. We do however have several that this program benefits. By having an alternative education program available in town and at school, students are more likely to attend school. These students are able to see friendly familiar faces that they feel comfortable with. If we were to not have our own program, we would have to try to find a school to coop with which could be some distance away. It would be in a strange school with instructors they do not know and may not feel comfortable around. This could deter students from attending and increase their risk of dropping out.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Having an alternative education program allows students that may not feel comfortable in a traditional school setting the comfort of having their own space. They do not have to walk the halls between classes and see a lot of students that may make them feel uncomfortable. However, we do offer students that want to be involved the opportunity. If students feel that they can be successful in a certain subject area in a traditional classroom setting they may go to that classroom. If students are on track to graduate they may even go to the Career Technology Center outside their allotted time for alternative education.

Chief Academy will meet from 7:45 AM until 11:58 AM. They will meet everyday of the scheduled school calendar. We will use edgenuity as the curriculum platform which provides the assessments needed for each class.

We will have a very negative financial impact if we are not granted this waiver. I believe the closest school district that we could possibly coop with is an hour away. We would have to hire an employee to drive any alternative education to the location and wait on site to drive them back. This would also require a vehicle to be in use everyday and not be able to be used for any other activities during the school day. This could cause our district to possibly having to purchase a another vehicle which we cannot afford at this time.

Teachers are evaluated using the TLE model. Any student in our alternative education program will take the same assessments as our other students.





A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Okeene High School is requesting a deregulation of the Alternative Education program based on the needs of our students. After evaluating the alternative education program, we feel that we can best serve our students with a credit recovery program offered throughout our school day. We have a specific room and teacher designated to offer credit recovery to our at-risk students. Students who are participating in this program are given targeted attention in a small group setting. If our students are unable to attend these recovery classes, they may become frustrated trying to catch up in the traditional classroom. Also, these students need an adult frequently checking on their progress and this program allows for the credit recovery teacher to check and mentor them on a daily basis.

Okeene had previously had a co-op with Canton Public Schools. Canton is located 16 miles from Okeene. This was a wonderful program to work with, but the alternative education team didn't feel like it met the needs of all of our struggling students. The students who attended this program missed several electives offered at our school. These students are now able to attend these classes while making up credits in our credit recovery program. This also allows them to be included in school activities and events. We currently have 12 students using our Credit Recovery program. That is close to 11% of our high school students who are benefiting from this program.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Students who are at-risk of not graduating meet with the high school counselor and principal to discuss options for how to best catch them up. Then a course of instruction plan is made to ensure they are on track for graduation. Programs are assigned after all of this has been discussed and agreed upon. We feel as a school that we can better serve these students in our own building rather than co-oping with a nearby school. It is hard for our students to make accommodations to travel to a nearby school. They also miss out on opportunities to participate in some elective classes when in a full time credit recovery program. We have had little success with the traditional alternative education program. While the program itself has been successful and engaging for our students, they become quickly disconnected from our school community and many end up dropping out when they turn 18.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Yes, we have had a co-op with Canton Public Schools before. We were awarded a waiver last school year. The credit recovery program we implemented will continue to help our seniors graduate this school year. In previous years we have seen our credit recovery program help our graduation success as much as 26%. Without this program I strongly feel that 2-3 of our students would not graduate with their senior class. This plan does not affect other school sites. This plan helps our students recover needed credits while allowing them to experience a normal high school environment.

We Star test all students enrolled in Okeene JH/HS. We look and compare reading levels 3-4 times per year. We also look at the progression of students in our Edgenuity program. We are able to closely monitor this to make sure students are on track and keeping up with the pace of the class.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

Even though the financial impact to the district will be negative because the ESSER funding is no longer available, we strongly feel that the success we have had in the past with our credit recovery program along with the qualified staff that supported it, will outweigh any cost to the district.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, i.e., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

We will be using course completion percentages, STAR Reading scores, ACT, and graduation rates to evaluate our program.

ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION

Students at Okeene who are at risk for high school or junior high failure for a variety of reasons which may include academic deficiency, behavioral difficulties, excessive absences, pregnancy or parenting, adjustment problems, or juvenile justice involvement may be allowed to attend an alternative education program.

If a student is at risk and wants to attend an alternative education program a committee will meet to decide whether the student's criteria warrants acceptance into such a program. The committee will be appointed each year by the high school principal. This committee will consist of two (2) teachers, the high school counselor, and the high school principal. It will also include one parent/guardian of the student who has asked to attend the alternative education program. If the student is 18 years old they may serve on the committee in lieu of their parent/guardian. The committee will meet to discuss the merit of the student's need or aptitude for attending an alternative education program. The committee will vote and by a simple majority of the five (5) person committee the student will be allowed or not allowed to attend an alternative education program.

If a student is not allowed to attend, the student may go through the committee process again during the semester following their denial by the committee.

If a student is allowed to attend, any credits received will not affect the student's grade point average on their transcript. For each class completed at the alternative education site the student will receive the required credit but will receive no grade on their transcript. The specific alternative education program that the student is allowed to attend is at the discretion of Okeene Public Schools, its administration, and its Board of Education. All transportation to the alternative education site will be provided by the student and is not the responsibility of Okeene Public Schools.

Mission Statement

The mission of Carnegie High School in partnership with the community is to provide a comprehensive, caring educational experience for all students. Carnegie High School believes that each child, through their own unique talents, will be a productive citizen.

The **goals** of the program include: (1) A reduced drop-out rate; (2) A completion of academic credits; (3) A decrease in the number of classes failed; (4) A reduction in absences; and (5) A reduction in behavioral problems.

Class begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 12:15 p.m. each weekday. Within this time frame, a schedule for each student will be created based on individual needs. This type of scheduling encourages creative teaching, provides greater flexibility, allows greater opportunity for individualization of assignments, and fosters the creation of a more supportive classroom atmosphere for students. Parents are encouraged to play an active role in the student's education. Students attend routine career and group counseling.

Disciplinary Policy

Discipline is the development of self-control, character, and proper consideration for other people. The following are expected for each student:

1. Appropriate behavior, which assures the right of every student to learn and the teacher to teach.
2. Daily attendance and arrival on time. Late arrivals will be dealt with on an individual basis.
3. Appropriate usage of facilities and materials.
4. Adherence to acceptable standards of courtesy, decency, honesty, and compliance with civil law.

Falling short of these expectations and/or serious infractions of acceptable behavior involving truancy/tardiness, tobacco products, vaping, drugs/alcohol, or dangerous/deadly weapons for example may lead to detention, suspension without services, or expulsion from the program.



- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

The Hydro-Eakly Alternative Resource Training (HEART) has demonstrated long-term success of keeping at-risk students in school and providing pathways for future success. The nearest alt. ed. site is in Weatherford, which is 10 miles from our school. However, most of our students are more comfortable and more motivated in the small-school setting of Hydro-Eakly. Our concern is that many of our at-risk students would drop out of school if they had to attend school at a different site. Since our alt. ed. classroom is within our high school building, these students also maintain relationships and receive encouragement from our traditional teachers. The program serves 2-3% of our high school student body on average.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The lead teacher in our alt. ed. program is committed to working with at-risk students. His background includes serving as a teacher in a facility for at-risk youth, teaching at a career tech center, teaching life skills classes, and working as a school counselor. The students complete core courses and some elective courses through the Edmentum virtual learning program. Each student has his or her own dedicated workspace in the classroom. Students are given options for the afternoon portion of the program: career tech programs, work study, or traditional classes in our high school.

The graduation rate of the HEART program has been approximately 80% over the last five years.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have served as the LEA of a COOP the last three years. No students from other sites enrolled in the program, leading to the mutual decision to dissolve the COOP. This has resulted in Hydro-Eakly seeking this waiver to continue offering a successful alt. ed. program at our site.

HEART is operated each school day from 7:30 AM to 12:30 PM. HEART student follow the District calendar.

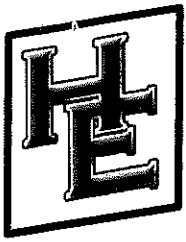

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Boise City Public Schools is a small, rural school with a student population (fewer than 300 PK-12) and at this time and in the foreseeable future, we will not have 10 or more students that would be eligible and benefit from a true Alternative Education program. Also, our location precludes the feasibility of effectively entering into a COOP to provide Alt Ed to our very few if any eligible students. The nearest school that offers a true program that could be approached for a COOP is Guymon School that is located 60 miles from Boise City. So that is not a realistic option for our students. We have been very effective this year and in the past with providing credit recovery for students who are not on track to graduate on time and that is the course that we believe is the most beneficial to our students and to the district capabilities.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The district will begin offering Edgenuity courses to students to help each of them fulfill their educational goals while enrolled here and beyond. The district is very aware and sensitive to the individual needs of each student. It is certainly not a new concept that every student is not well suited to "regular" classrooms and traditional methods of instruction. The program we do offer here, though not a true Alternative Education Academy, has proven very effective in ensuring that the district offers all of our students a free, appropriate education to the best of our abilities and within the resources available to us. Our graduation rates continue to be very high, and every student that has made efforts to put forth the required academic effort has been successful. The only students who have not completed graduation requirements on time are those that have chosen not to utilize the options given them to succeed. We have had an Alternative Education waiver in the past, and the fact that one continues to be necessary speaks at least in part to the fact that the district has become increasingly more adept at keeping students in traditional classroom where the students are becoming more successful overall and are not needing to be educated in an alternative manner.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact on other sites in the district.

The district did participate in an Alternative Education COOP some years ago with the neighboring district of Keyes, which is now defunct and has been

annexed into the Boise City district. At that time, Boise City was the LEA that actually had an Alternative Education program and Keyes was the smaller district that joined with Boise City. Boise City School has applied for and been awarded a waiver in the past, and available data indicates that effect of the waiver on the performance levels of the district students due to the waiver has been minimal to nonexistent. Our students are still performing well academically and graduating at a very high rate while utilizing only a traditional classroom setting or a traditional setting combined with our credit recovery program.

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary

Due to the fact that we are not now considered to have a true Alternative Education program, we do not have schedules, calendars, assessment forms or other forms that would be relevant only to Alternative Education and that differentiate significantly from the regular curriculum. The daily schedules and calendars are the same for most of our credit recovery students as for the students that attend classes "normally". As far as assessing who should be enrolled in the district's credit recovery programs, students who are not on track to graduate on time are offered credit recovery and those that have some type of significant extenuating circumstances are offered credit recovery. For example, in the past, we had a senior boy who was the only caregiver for his mother who was paralyzed in a terrible car accident. The district placed this student on totally online schooling so that he could take care of his mother and still be educated. As another example, we had another senior student in a different school year that was diagnosed with a malignant brain tumor and spent that year in and out of school for treatments. He was able to complete his education on time and graduate with his class by utilizing our credit recovery program.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

Since the district does not have a sufficient number of students to have a true Alternative Education program and there is not another district that has such a program within a reasonable distance to make a COOP feasible, the waiver will actually prove financially positive to the district. We do not have the student numbers, but even if we did, the expense to the district to employ the personnel necessary to operate the program would far outweigh the funds that are available from the state for this district. The district does have significant expenses to utilize the credit recovery/virtual education program that is in place. However, the funds dedicated to Alternative Education are not used to carry out the current programs in the district. The district would be willing and happy to use Alternative Education funding to support our programs, but if that is not possible, we will continue to

identify student needs and educate our students as best we can. Our programs have proven effective.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

The district personnel and students are very aware of the need to closely monitor the effectiveness of the programs in place for educating our students who are not necessarily best served in the regular classrooms or who have not been academically successful in the past. The district personnel have and will continue to monitor individual student grades/performance in the classes in which they are enrolled as methods of formative assessments of the individual program effectiveness. Also, ACT scores, state testing scores as well as graduation rates of those students who are being educated in a more non-traditional manner are monitored and compared to those of traditional students. Thus far, the district's non-traditional students tend to perform as well as all others.

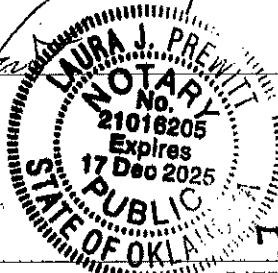



The reason for a request for fewer than ten students is because Bokoshe has chose not to coop with our district this school year. Bokoshe is starting their own program. We have enjoyed serving as the receiving district and they have been a pleasure to work with. Keota is not certain we will serve more than ten students without the coop.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

All potential candidates must go through the review process committee to determine the need and eligibility for alternative education placement. The committee consists of the principal, counselor, and alternative education teacher. This program is in place to assist the educational needs and success of students that are academically deprived, a teen parent, a student lacking social skills, adequate to participate in the regular classroom, physically handicapped or any other reason deemed legitimate by the committee. The students attend during the evenings and are able to go to a job or stay home to take care of his/her child during the day. The class sizes are small and conducive to at-risk students, flexible scheduling, goal-setting, service learning opportunities, and assistance with higher education or work. The counselor, librarian, and special education teacher are available to students during alt ed hours.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Yes, previously Keota Public School (receiving district) has coop with Bokoshe Public School (sending district) the past several years. Bokoshe chose not to coop and will be beginning their own program. To my knowledge, this is the first year we are not in coop with Bokoshe.

The alternative education program assists those students who are at high risk in successfully graduating high school on time by accommodating needs that may be present and cannot be met during the regular school day program.

Graduation rates are higher with alternative education services.

The school uses the alt ed funds provided to offset the cost to the district. The district feels that any funds provided from the general fund is worth the cost because the outcome of our students who need the program far outweighs the cost of the program. Without the alt ed program, many of our students would not graduate.

- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

The school uses graduation data, ACT scores, dropout data, attendance records, and credits earned to determine the effectiveness of the program. Students in our program are monitored closely through Imagine Learning (formerly Edgenuity) to decide what interventions are needed in order for each student to have the means to be successful. Graduation from high school is the end goal for all students in the program.



Newkirk Schools is requesting a waiver to allow the alternative education program to continue with fewer than 10 students. The nearest school to coop with is approximately 19 miles, one way. We firmly believe that our students who need the alternative education program services at our site would drop out if they are required to continue the drive to the school that we have previously cooperated with.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

The program will serve students face to face with an individualized education platform. I believe that this opportunity will benefit our at-risk students and will provide them a well rounded education that includes weekly counseling and structures in place to ensure their success.

- C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The purpose for providing this resource is to increase our graduation rate to 100%. While I acknowledge that this is a lofty goal, I believe that providing our students with another way to "do" school will place them in a position where they can experience success. Student performance levels will also be increased by providing our students with a smaller class size and more individualized instruction. We are optimistic that these students will show a higher level of attendance and greater success in their coursework. Likewise these students should also show an increased level of satisfaction within their educational program.

Idabel Public Schools is requesting a waiver/deregulation [REDACTED] OAC 210:35-29-2 "Abbreviated Day." An educational benefit is expected for students. An increased graduation rate and decreased dropout rate is expected. A better method for meeting the needs of at-risk students will be realized. A financial savings to the district will be realized. The ability to use instructors on staff rather than adding additional instructors is expected. Finding qualified, certified staff is difficult. This deregulation will allow the use of highly qualified teachers already on staff and relieve the pressure of finding additional, qualified staff.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

We propose to keep the Alternative Education Program school day as Monday through Thursday from 3:30-7:45 p.m. We expect to see continued improvement in student performance because of having instructors available in all four core subject areas. We also expect to see a financial benefit to the district from having four part-time academy instructors who are also full-time instructors in the regular high school as opposed to having two full-time academy instructors. Furthermore, the students who typically participate in Alternative Education are those students who are at risk of not graduating high school. Most of these students in Idabel are either emancipated, working full-time at jobs to help support families, or who are raising their own children. Evening hours are most beneficial to serving these students.

- C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

Alternative Education program school day will be 3:30-7:45 p.m., Monday-Thursday. The alternative education program will follow the same schedule as Idabel High School with the exception of Fridays. The alternative education program will also incorporate distance learning options.

We expect to see increased improvement in student performance by utilizing four core subject teachers to help instruct and provide assistance to these students. We also expect to see a continued improvement in the four year graduation rate and a continued decrease in the dropout rate.

The district should see a savings in salary expenditures: two Alternative Instructors who would be necessary if the program was conducted during the same hours as the high school classes are reassigned as teachers in the comprehensive high school. Four core teachers already on staff in regular classes will receive a stipend for added time spent in the Alternative Program. The director of Alternative Education is also currently employed as a district technology staff member and distance learning coordinator.

In effect the district has replaced two full-time instructors for the cost of four part-time stipends. This saves the district two full-time salaries.

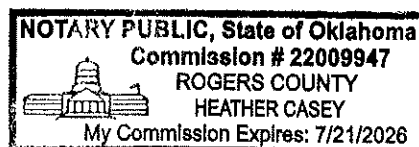

Sequoyah Public Schools ended the 2022/23 school year with 8 students. We will be working to add additional students to the Alternative Education Program, but will be starting the school year below the 10-student threshold. This is the pattern for our program. As students are added to the program during the school year, we reach the 10- student threshold, but start below it annually. If we were to coop with another district, the students would have to travel over 15 miles each way.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Sequoyah Public School has had a successful AL program for almost 20 years in a stand-alone model and will continue to have the same educational and career-seeking opportunities for our AL students in the future. Our goal of increasing student count will be focused on students in 8th through 10th grade in order to connect with those students earlier. We will be turning to our classroom teachers at both the high school and middle school for information regarding potential students.

Sequoyah Public Schools have not participated in an alternative education coop.

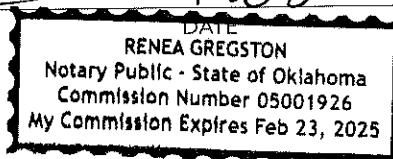

- A. We have had an alternative education program on site for more than four years. If we receive this waiver we can continue to educate our students on site. Comanche would be the nearest alternative education site which is 30 minutes away and we do not have a co-op agreement with them. Due to the transportation issue we would have to limit the number of students and times they would be able to attend. Not all students are in the program full time. Our program, as it is now, is able to benefit students and not waste time for traveling.
- B. Our program is self-paced and presented from modules. Students are able to complete only the needed modules. Students must complete an exam which shows they have met minimum proficiency requirements for that particular subject. After the final exam is given, credit is awarded according to the specifications for each subject.
- C. The waiver will allow us to continue our program without having the minimum of ten students enrolled at all times. Parents and students are provided with progress reports on a weekly basis. Certificates of completion will be given to those students who have successfully completed a course.
- D. We are requesting a one year statutory waiver. All requested artifacts are attached.
- E. The program receives great support from the regular education teachers. The goal of all of our teachers is for students to successfully complete their education and be prepared to contribute to society in a positive way. Many of our students have graduated only because of their opportunity to participate in the alternative education program. Approving the waiver would give us the ability to work with our students in house and would save us the cost of transporting them to an alternative site.
- F. The request to participate in the program may be initiated by a parent, teacher, administrator, or counselor. A meeting with the school counselor is held to discuss the needs of the individual student and their future education. Before a final decision can be made, regular education teachers and administrators are also part of the process to determine if the alternative education program will be the best placement for the student. Student needs will be reevaluated each semester to determine if the alternative placement continues to be the best placement for that student.

Development of the program is an ongoing process as the needs of individual students may change. Students and teachers are continually being assessed to make sure program objectives are being met.

An annual report is sent to the Oklahoma State Department of Education. A self evaluation of the program will also be completed at the end of the school year. Changes will be made as needed to improve the program so it continues to meet the needs of Bray-Doyle students.

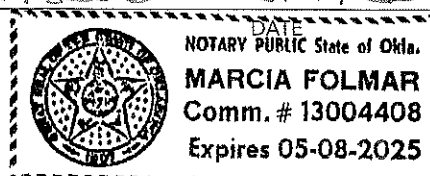

The Marlow STAR (Alt Ed) Program in the last several years only has four to five students need the services/program. Marlow High School student population historically graduates on time. For the very few who may require make up courses in a given year, this is provided through on-line coursework (Odyssey Ware) The travel distance to a potential co-op would be over 10 miles and take around 20 minutes travel time. If the waiver is denied, the district would not have enough students needing Alt Ed to meet the student enrollment threshold. Our graduation rate is extremely high 90 percentile consistently or higher. The district is able to meet the needs of all students currently even though we do not have a full program.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Marlow High School's alternate plan is to continue with what has proven to work. By continuing to offer the STAR program and access to Odyssey Ware for credit recovery as well as certified tutoring, counseling, career-tech coursework, and concurrent enrollment all of our student's need are being properly met. The educational benefits for our students is being met and done so in the least restricted environment by allowing students to be a part of the regular school day for most of the day. We sought a waiver in 2022-23 and it was granted. The graduation rate for last school year was 100%. The other benefit is seen in that we historically have very few students lacking credits to be on pace for graduation with their cohort.

We sought a waiver in 2022-23 and it was granted. The graduation rate for last school year was 100%. The statutory waiver allowed the district to stay in compliance. Without it, and the lack of need by our students, there would be no way we would meet the minimum enrollment standard. The 100% graduation rate is a sign our efforts are successful as well. The impact on other sites was minimal to nothing as there were no students denied access to the program.

The negative impact to the district is we acknowledge by not being able to meet the enrollment levels required to have a fully approved program per the guidelines means we will not receive any funding. The funding has historically been used to help pay for the on-line instructional software, Alt Ed teacher partial salary, etc. These expenses would now be on the district to meet. The funding level is not high enough to fully fund the Alt Ed program so the district has always had to provide additional funding to meet the need. We have already made budget adjustments so that can continue offering the full services/ program we always have so that we protect the instruction/support we provide for the students.

Mr. Young and our other certified teachers who may provide tutoring will be evaluated using the OKTLE system. The High School principal will be evaluated using the McREL system. 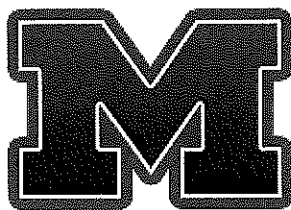



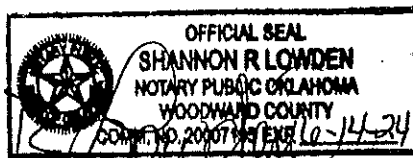

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Fort Supply has been in an alternative education coop for at least the past 15 years with Woodward Public Schools. Beginning in the school year 2023-2024, that coop no longer exists. The nearest coop is in Enid, OK which is 80 miles away. It is for this reason Fort Supply Schools is requesting a waiver for an Alternative Education Program for the next three school years. Fort Supply has utilized the program for only one student in the last five years. In referencing the District Needs Assessment list for 2022-23, the district had discipline numbers at 1% and attendance numbers at 3%. If this waiver were to be denied, Fort Supply would have to employ a half-day teacher for a small number of students grade 7-12, putting an undue hardship on the district.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. Being a small school district (143 PK-12), our full-time teachers are already teaching multiple grade levels on a regular basis. At-risk students, according to the District Needs Assessment list are currently being served in the regular classroom with their peer and have individual help when it is needed. Grades 11-12 attend High Plains Technology Center in Woodward for the first three hours of the school day, then return to Fort Supply to complete their core classes. Counseling services are also available to all students.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. 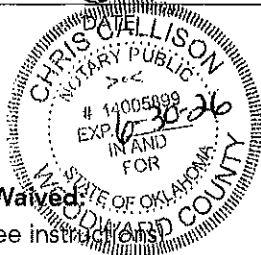

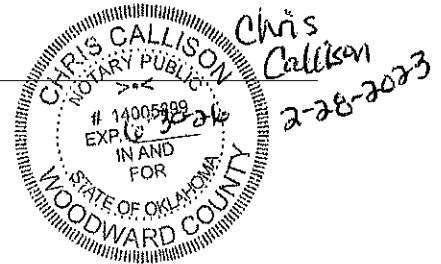

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. We have had in-house alternative education for three years beginning in SY 2021. We felt we have a need to serve students in a smaller environment. We identify a small population of students the year before in grades 9-12 that are at-risk of not graduating from HS for various reasons.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The students being served in our alternative education program will have the opportunity to come to school with a modified schedule. The ability to arrive later will give students a more viable chance of attending school.

Students will be allowed to participate in all extra-curricular activities and electives to ensure a more normal school setting. Students will participate in class events such as senior picture trips, homecoming events and assemblies when possible. These students will have access to counselors more often than in a regular school setting and will be introduced to many life-skills through field trips to local and area businesses.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

We were in a coop in SY 2020 with Woodward. We have been awarded this waiver in SY 2021, but did not apply for it in SY 2022 as we began the year with more than 10 students. We are applying for the three-year waiver in case we drop below 10 students at any time in the next few years.

- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

Creating an in-house alternative education program has added some financial strain to our school. We are currently paying a teacher to serve 8-10 students in the program and have for the past three school years. Even though this seems like a negative impact on our school financially, we feel that the positive outcomes of at-risk students begin successful in school and eventually graduating outweigh the negative.

- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

Our alternative education teacher will still be observed using the TLE requirements. If alternative education students feel like their goals are to attend a trade school, college or university, we will provide them with the necessary tools to participate in the ACT test. We feel that assisting these at-risk students in as many ways as possible will only increase the graduation rates and decrease the number of drop-outs.


