Ignite Christian Academy (ICA) request approval to participate in the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship for Students with Disabilities program. They are accredited through Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and recognized by the Oklahoma Private School Accreditation Commission charged by the Oklahoma State Department of Education with overseeing educational quality of accredited private schools in the state.

ICA offers a small classroom environment with instructional strategies designed to support individual learners. Accommodations include quiet spaces for students who need opportunities to regulate their emotions or reduce sensory stimulation, as well as noise-reducing headphones and other sensory supports for students who benefit from a quieter learning environment. Additional supports include small-group instruction, reading interventions, assistive reading tools, and modified instructional strategies and pacing.

To further enrich the educational experience, ICA partners with volunteers, retired educators, and experienced professionals who generously give their time to provide students with additional academic support, mentoring, tutoring, classroom assistance, and encouragement.

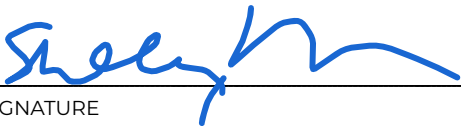
The Lindsey Nicole Henry (LNH) Scholarship Act requires participating schools to be physical, brick-and-mortar institutions in Oklahoma and meet certain approval criteria. Schools must provide documentation to show they comply, which will be reviewed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE). The OSDE will approve a private school for the scholarship program if it meets the following criteria:

1. The private school must demonstrate fiscal soundness by having been in operation for one (1) year or providing the OSDE with a statement by a certified public accountant confirming that the private school is insured and the owner or owners have sufficient capital or credit to operate the school for the upcoming year by serving the number of students anticipated with expected revenues from tuition and other sources that may be reasonably expected. In lieu of a statement, a surety bond or letter of credit for the amount equal to the scholarship funds for any quarter may be filed with the Oklahoma State Department of Education. ***Proof of compliance required. Save in a PDF, and label it Criteria 1.***
2. The private school must comply with the antidiscrimination provision of 42 U.S.C. § 2000d. ***Proof of compliance required. Save in a PDF, and label it Criteria 2.***
3. The private school must employ or contract with teachers who hold baccalaureate or higher degrees, or have at least three (3) years of teaching experience in public instruction in subjects taught. ***Proof of compliance required. A statement or excerpt from the school policies or handbook stating the educational requirement for the teaching staff is acceptable documentation. Save in a PDF, and label it Criteria 3.***

Background and Transition from Living Water Christian Academy to Ignite Christian Academy

Living Water Christian Academy (LWCA) opened its doors in 2020 with a vision to provide Christ-centered education to families in our community. Over the next five years, the school experienced steady growth, expanding its enrollment each year and serving approximately 40 students during the 2025–2026 school year. During this time, the school also achieved a significant milestone by earning accreditation through the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), completing the accreditation process in late 2024 and receiving official accreditation for the 2025–2026 school year.

Following the retirement of the school's Head of School and the transition of three-fourths of the governing board during the 2025–2026 school year, the new leadership recognized a unique opportunity to strengthen the school's vision while preserving the strong foundation that had already been established. Rather than simply continuing under the existing name, the leadership chose to rebrand the school as **Ignite Christian Academy**, reflecting a renewed mission, fresh direction, and an even clearer commitment to serving students and families.

While Ignite Christian Academy carries a new name, it is not a new beginning from scratch. The school's accreditation is still in place. The school continues to build upon the educational excellence, accreditation, and Christ-centered foundation established by Living Water Christian Academy. The transition represents growth and renewed purpose rather than a departure from the school's history.

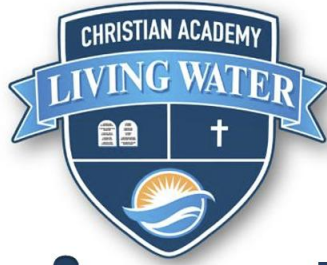
Ignite Christian Academy's mission is:

Teacher Education and Certification Policy

Purpose

Ignite Christian Academy is committed to providing students with an excellent Christ-centered education through qualified, knowledgeable, and dedicated educators. To ensure high academic standards and instructional excellence, all teaching staff are expected to meet the following educational and certification requirements.

Educational Requirements

All applicants seeking a teaching position at Ignite Christian Academy must possess, at minimum, a **bachelor's degree** from an accredited college or university. Degrees should be appropriate to the grade level or subject area being taught.

Applicants who do not meet this minimum educational requirement will not be considered for employment as classroom teachers.

Teacher Certification Requirements

All teachers employed by Ignite Christian Academy are required to obtain and maintain one of the following professional teaching credentials:

- A valid **State of Oklahoma Teaching Certificate**, or
- A valid **Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) Teacher Certification**.

Teachers who do not hold one of these certifications at the time of hire may be employed with the understanding that they will begin the certification process immediately and obtain the required certification **within six (6) months of their employment date**.

Employment Expectations

Teachers are expected to:

- Provide documentation of their bachelor's degree prior to employment.
- Submit proof that they have applied for the appropriate certification within a reasonable time after employment begins.
- Complete all certification requirements within six (6) months of their hire date unless an extension is approved by the Head of School due to circumstances beyond the teacher's control.
- Maintain all required certifications in good standing throughout their employment.

Failure to make satisfactory progress toward certification or to obtain the required certification within the established timeframe may result in disciplinary action, including reassignment or termination of employment.

Commitment to Professional Excellence

Ignite Christian Academy values educators who are lifelong learners and servant leaders. Teachers are encouraged to pursue ongoing professional development, instructional growth, and spiritual maturity as they partner with families to educate, encourage, and equip students for lives of faith, excellence, and service. Our desire is to cultivate a faculty that models Christ-like character while delivering high-quality, biblically integrated instruction that inspires every student to reach their God-given potential.

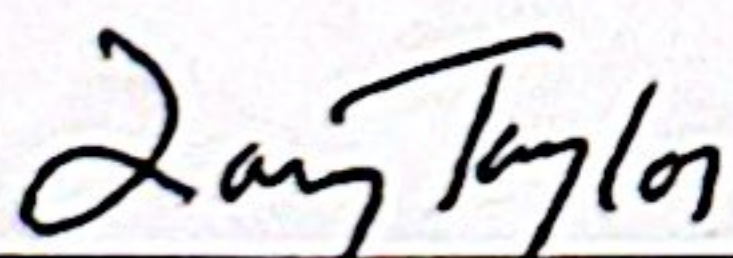

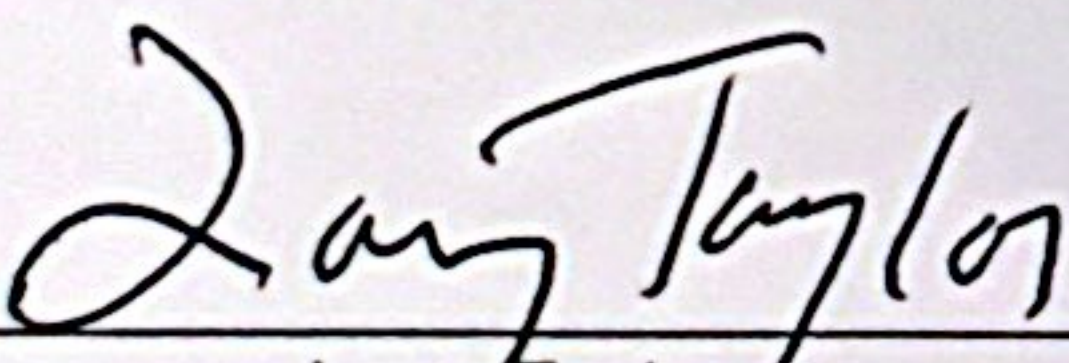

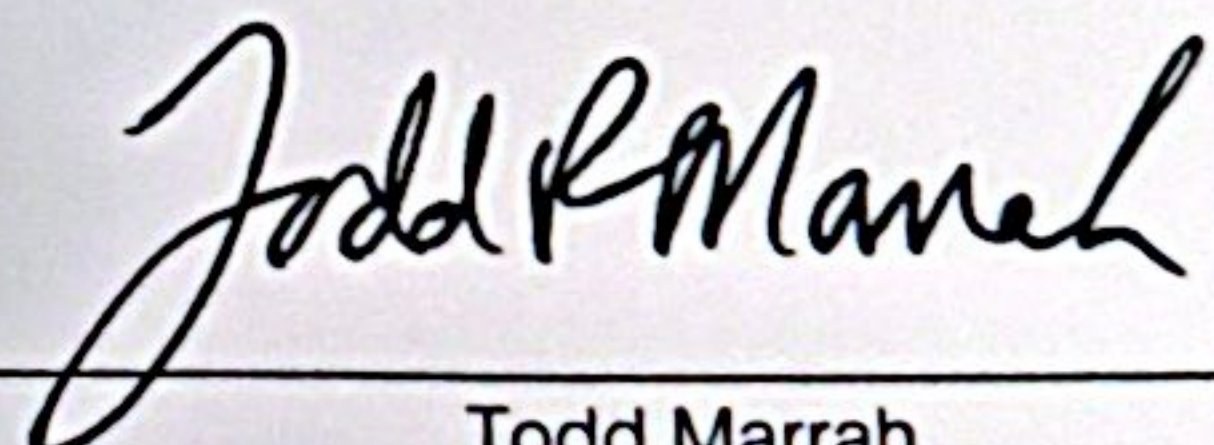

Services, Programs, and Support for Students with Disabilities

At Ignite Christian Academy, we believe every child is fearfully and wonderfully made by God, uniquely gifted with individual strengths, talents, and learning styles. We recognize that no two students learn the same way, and because of that, we do not expect students to fit into a one-size-fits-all educational model. Instead, we intentionally tailor each student's educational experience to help them grow academically, spiritually, socially, and emotionally while reaching their fullest God-given potential.

Our philosophy is simple: **we meet students where they are and help them become who God created them to be.** Whether a student learns quickly, requires additional support, has experienced trauma, has autism, dyslexia, ADHD, or another learning difference, our teachers strive to understand each child's unique needs and provide individualized strategies that promote confidence, growth, and success.

Our classrooms are intentionally designed to be welcoming, therapeutic, calming, and engaging learning environments. We understand that students learn best when they feel safe, valued, and understood. Flexible classroom spaces allow students to learn in ways that best support their individual needs. While traditional desks are available, students may also choose alternative learning spaces such as floor seating, bar-height tables, or other flexible seating options during appropriate learning activities. These choices encourage comfort, focus, and engagement.

Teachers thoughtfully adapt the classroom environment and instructional strategies to support individual learners. Examples of accommodations and supports may include:

- Quiet spaces or calming corners for students who need opportunities to regulate emotions or reduce sensory stimulation.
- Noise-reducing headphones or other sensory supports for students who benefit from a quieter learning environment.
- Small-group or individualized instruction to reinforce academic concepts.
- Reading interventions, assistive reading tools such as reading pens, or additional literacy support for students with dyslexia or other reading challenges.
- Modified instructional strategies and pacing based on each student's learning profile.

- Frequent encouragement, positive reinforcement, and relationship-centered teaching that builds confidence and resilience.

We also recognize that some students come to us carrying challenges beyond academics. Students who have experienced trauma, including those in foster or kinship care, often benefit from consistent relationships, encouragement, patience, and a strong sense of belonging. Our faculty intentionally creates a culture where every child is known by name, celebrated for who they are, and reminded that they are deeply loved and valued. We believe that healing, growth, and learning flourish in an environment built on trust, grace, and genuine care.

Our teachers work closely with families to understand each student's strengths, needs, and learning goals. Open communication and partnership with parents allow us to make thoughtful adjustments that support each child's educational journey while encouraging continued growth at home and at school.

Although Ignite Christian Academy is a small school, we believe our size is one of our greatest strengths. Our smaller classrooms allow us to build meaningful relationships with each student and provide the individualized attention they deserve.
