Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs Launches Online Search Tool for Approved Educational Programs

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK – April 14, 2025 – The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs (ODVA), through its State Approving Agency (SAA), proudly announces the launch of a new web-based tool that allows veterans, service members, and their families to search for approved educational and training programs across the state.

This powerful new feature, available through the ODVA website, or at https://saa.odva.ok.gov/Utility/SaaApproved.php, enables users to quickly and securely search by program type—such as "Welding", "Biology", or "Business"—to view a comprehensive list of institutions currently authorized for VA education benefits. Each listing includes essential details like program name, institution name, location, and more, ensuring veterans can make informed choices about their educational and career pathways.

The system was developed with modern usability and accessibility in mind, using a simple intuitive display of results via a secure and mobile-friendly interface. Users can conduct multiple searches and access supporting links to key VA resources such as the GI Bill® Comparison Tool and VA's official education benefits site.

Executive Director James Bynum noted, "At ODVA, we are committed to eliminating barriers to access and opportunity for Oklahoma's veteran community. This new tool reflects our dedication to innovation, transparency, and practical service.
